A goal by Robertson with less than a minute to go in the third period enabled Collingwood to strangle Georgetown Hunter Realtors' bid for win number thirteen in Collingwood Saturday night as the Hunters had to be satisfied with a 4-all tie.

Collingwood had pulled their goalie for six attackers when they netted the equalizer at 18:25.
