**Retired School Principal  
Served on Cemetery Board**

A former principal of Georgetown public school, Miss Annie Ryan, died at the age of eight-one on Monday, January 5th, at St. Joseph's Hospital, Geolp, after being in ill health for some time.

Miss Ryan lived a very rich and full life as an educator and in community affairs. Twenty years ago she retired after being principal of the school for twelve years and a teacher in Georgetown for over forty.

Her parents, Katherine Dalton Ryan and Charles Ryan, her brother and sister, Katherine of Georgetown and Charles of Brazil, have all predeceased her. Three nephews, Dalton, and Glyn of Brazil, Dr. Ross Ryan of Toronto and a niece Katherine of Brazil survive as do two great nephews, Nicholas and Charles of Brazil who are attending Ridley College.

Receiving her public and high school education in Georgetown she attended Milton Model School for Teachers after which she taught for one year then attended Ottawa Normal School and from there back to teach in Georgetown where she spent her teaching career.

After her retirement Miss Ryan acted as a member of the Public School Board. She was secretary of the Cemetery Board and a very active member of the Red Cross.

Father Thomas Van Laer officiated at Holy Cross R.C. Church when requiem mass was sung on Wednesday, January 7th, at 10.00 a.m. Pallbearers were Harold Marshall, Dr. Ross Ryan, Dalton Cummings, John R. Barber, Dick Licata and John D. Kelly. Interment was in Greenwood Cemetery, Georgetown.
