TWO CARS DAMAGED BY HIT & RUNNERS

Mrs. H. G. Howard, of 34 Victoria Street and Kenneth Davidson of 8 Campbell Gate were the victims of hit and run accidents, which occurred over the weekend and in both instances the damage was not discovered until the following day.

Mrs. Howard left her car, a 1958 Dodge, on the south side of Cross St. just east of Norton Apartments, at 6.30 Friday evening and the vehicle was in collision sometime between then and 11.30 p.m. when she returned to pick it up. The damage was discovered by Mrs. Howard at about 12.20 Saturday afternoon and the police notified immediately.

Investigation by Cst. Ted Scott revealed that the damage, estimated at \$75, had been done by a truck.

The Davidson car, a 1950 Nash, was rammed by a hit and run car while parked on the north shoulder of Campbell Gate well off the travelled portion of the road. Tire marks were clearly visible leading up to the Davidson car ending in a skid of about 10'.

The incident occurred some time Friday evening and was discovered at about 10 o'clock Saturday morning. Cst. Ted Scott investigated and placed damage in the neighbourhood of \$75.

WILDWOOD INTERSECTION IS SCENE OF ACCIDENT

Cars driven by George D. Gracie, 131 Garden Drive, Oakville, and Gunter Bischoff, 210 Indian Rd., Toronto, were in collision at the intersection of No. 7 Highway and the Wildwood sideroad on Thursday, January 8th, resulting in an estimated total damage of \$95.

The collision occurred while the Gracie vehicle, a 1958 Chevrolet truck, was proceeding east on the highway and making a left turn onto Wildwood sideroad. The Bischoff car was westbound and had just rounded the turn at the north of Main Street. Cst. R. D. Whitson investigated.
