Her voice and expression told of stunned bewilderment at the news. Did it also hint of heartbreak? I'll always wonder!

AND I'VE ALWAYS thought a comedian like Imogene Coca could make a good skill out of how women react when dining alone, when seated at a table for two with a strange woman for a dining companion. Like the time a young matron and I dined in silence broken only by the embarrassed crunching of celery and cracking of hard rolls, until coffee was served. When she took out her cigarettes, she politely offered me one — and a delightful conversation ensued. Why she was practically a neighbour. Lived in Acton. Knew a lot of Georgetown people. We were real pals by the time we paid our check at the cash register.

Because I do feel self-conscious when dining alone in the city, I always head for the same restaurant... one which is frequented practically a hundred per cent by women. Perhaps because they feel the same way I do.

BUT WHEN dining out with friend husband I am much braver, and go to the other extreme. However the place the "Separate Tables" brings to my mind was not at all unusual or even interesting. But the people at the "separate table" right behind us, were.

AND WHAT WAS more, they didn't seem to care who knew it. We were seated so that I could see them. He was a handsome, suave-looking man, fortyish, and getting a little heavy-set. She matched him in age I should say, but her attractiveness had dissolved into a look of dissipation.

We were witnesses, along with everyone else in the dining room, to the break-up of their "affair." The woman was very upset — crying, berating, threatening, and pleading — all in a such loud voice, it wasn't at all hard to piece their story together. 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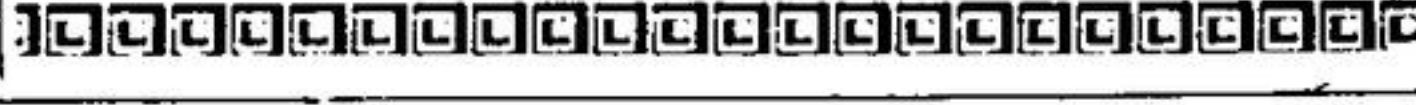
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
