Joe Martin Still Spry Cheerful '93 Next Week

Still spry and cheerful, Georgetown's oldest citizen and veteran entertainer, Joe Martin, will be 93 on Wednesday, April 1st.
The father of Fred and John Martin, Mrs. George Glassford and Mrs. Jack Armstrong, he did not enjoy his usual perfect health during the past winter, however, he has made a steady recovery and is again taking his frequent strolls downtown and greeting his many friends.
A year ago he made a surprisingly quick recovery from a fall he suffered around Christmas time and returned to a state of health where he could again display the step dancing and play the bones with the same smartness that won him awards at garden parties and talent contests in the past.
Two hundred and fifty acres on the Martin homestead at Caledon East were his work before he sold the farm thirty years ago and retired to Brampton. He moved to Georgetown with the death of Mrs. Martin 19 years ago and now resides with a daughter, Mrs. George Glassford, 9 Union St. He is the last surviving member of his family, and a son, Clinton, died in 1955.

Two New Members Join Public Library Board

Two new members joined the public library board at a meeting on March 17th.
Mrs. George C. Hewson, who is an appointee from the Roman Catholic separate school board, was elected treasurer, succeeding Gordon Tee, Mr. Tee, who has held the office for several years, is leaving town soon and resigned from the board recently. Replacing him on the board is Thomas Van Sickle, who is appointed by the public school board.

The board continued with plans for basement renovations at the meeting, accepting the tender of Hamilton Construction for the first stage of repairs. At a cost of over \$2,000, it is planned to remove the present partitions, take out the old flooring and replace this with a polished concrete floor. Two toilets will also be roughed in.
Continuing expansion of library service was noted in the report of librarian Rosemary Jordan. Forty-two new adult members, and an equal number of juniors were added to the rolls in February. A total of 3,142 books were on loan during the month.
A cataloguing project has been started at the library, with the aid of Miss Margaret Bunting, of Toronto Central Reference staff.

COUNTY NURSES MEET

The Halton Chapter of the Registered Nurses Association of Ontario, recently held a meeting in Milton with seventy-five attending. Dr. G. French of Oakville spoke on one of the comparatively new diseases—Toxoplasmosis. Dr.

French is associated with the Queensway General Hospital from which projective research will be carried out. Miss Vera Cope announced the plans of the forthcoming telephone bridge. Mrs. Gwen Korrey was in charge of the program. The next meeting will be held in Georgetown on May 11.

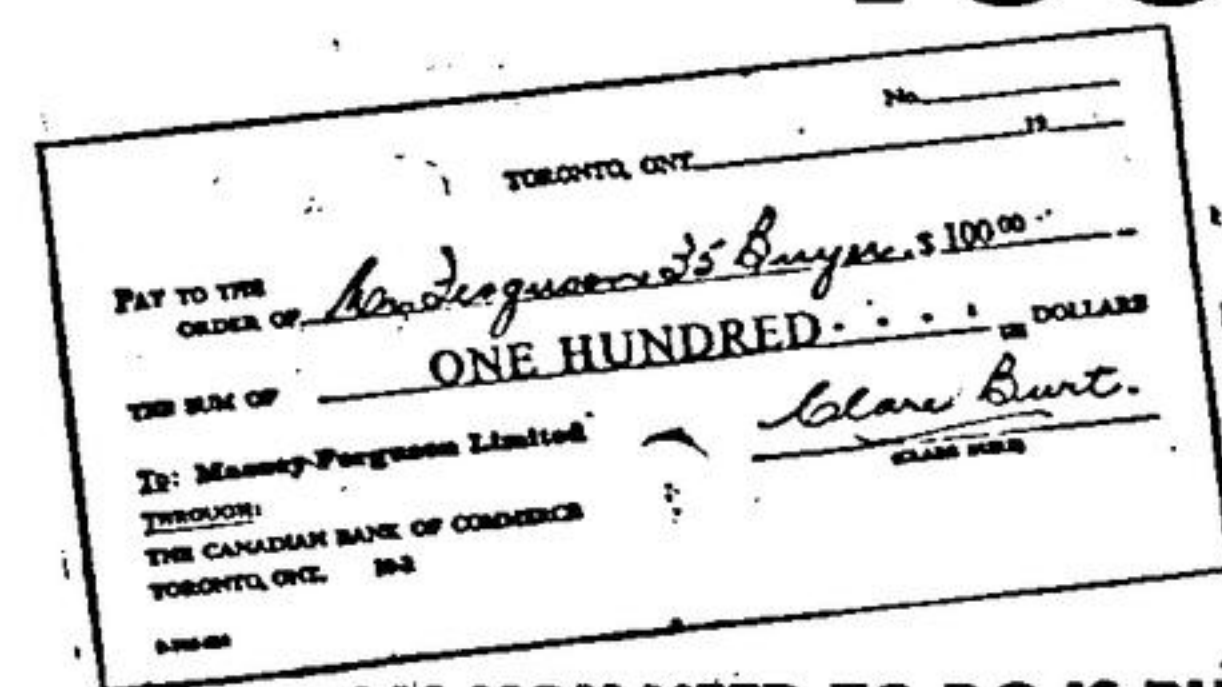
