

#### Highway Traffic Act

Section 10-(1): Whenever on a highway after dusk and before dawn, every motor vehicle shall carry three lighted lamps in a conspicuous posttion, one on each side of the front, which cast a white light, and one on the back of the vehicle which shall cast from its face a red light only, except in the case of a motorcycle, without a sidecar, which shall carry one at the front and one at the rear, and any lamp so used shall be clearly visible at a distance of at least 500 feet from the front or rear, as the case may be.
