Port Credit Hot To Witnesses' Assembly

Mr. George Brandford, presiding minister for the Georgetown congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses reported a very successful three-day assembly at Port Credit at Gordon Graydon Memorial School, on April 10-12. "The purpose of these assemblies is to improve the efficiency of our ministerial activity," Mr. Brandford commented. "The theme of the opening

session Friday evening was "Be a Teacher of the Good News", and this was enlarged upon by the ministry school program.

Jehovah's Witnesses believe that preaching responsibilities fall equally upon men and women and thus both gave talks and demonstrations during the course of the ministry school. During the remainder of the sessions Friday evening, ministers from various congregations, young and old gave experiences. The youngest was Brian Chamberlain from Bronte, age 8 years and the oldest minister was Theodore Farnsworth, from Brampton, 77 years old.

Saturday morning, after a consideration of the Bible text at 2 Corinthians 6:16 the assembled delegates dispersed to their field service activity. This consisted of calling door to door, encouraging the people to obtain the Bible study magazines "Watchtower" and "Awake" and also leaving a personal invitation for the special public discourse on Sunday afternoon. The baptism service was also provided on Saturday afternoon at the Port Credit Kingdom Hall. Baptism is a symbol of a dedication to the individual makes to serve God and engage in Christian ministry henceforth.

"Saturday afternoon," Mr. Brandford continued "the delegates assembled again to consider the figures and statistics on their ministerial activity. Some weaknesses were reported and suggestions offered to overcome these.

Strong points were also noted and encouragement was taken from the overall increase and expansion of the ministerial activity. There were 488 in attendance at this meeting.

Sunday was the concluding and climatic day of the assembly. In the morning the delegates made their final calls upon the public encouraging them to attend the special discourse "A Paradise Earth Through God's Kingdom". The speaker was Mr. V. White and he stated that earth is man's permanent home and that by an act of God a perfect government for blessing men of goodwill is due to come in our time, within this generation. The intricate relationship of the heavenly bodies in perfect orderliness is proof that there is an intelligent, supreme, all-governing, all-controlling Lawgiver, whose name is Jehovah in the Holy Bible.

The Bible shows that God foresaw all the human governments down to our day and describes them as beastly in their nature. (Revelation chapter 15 and 17 and Daniel chapter 7.) Under God's disapproval they have all ended in calamity, all having been controlled by God's chief enemy, Satan the Devil. The Creator has demonstrated his power to establish the best governments. Priest-King Melchizedek's rule of ancient Salem and the government of Israel established in the 16th century B.C. are examples. These governments were merely prophetic foreshadowings of the perfect government to come under which all the families and nations of the earth will be blessed.

Jesus was anointed from heaven with the spirit of God to be the king of the promised perfect government for mankind. The great time of tribulation beginning in 1914, with world war, famines, pestilences, earthquakes in one place after another, and the persecution of Jesus' followers is the proof of the establishment in the heavens of God's kingdom in harmony with the evidences Jesus foretold (Matthew 24, 7-14; Mark 13: 8-10.) After the battle of Armageddon at which the nations of this world will be destroyed (Daniel 2:44.) Perfect peace earth-wide with gradual upliftment of obedient mankind to perfection in body, mind and heart will follow. No storms, hurricanes or floods will destroy the dwelling places of mankind, and half of mankind will no more be on the brink of starvation but with weather regulated to perfection and no disturbers around, not even Satan the Devil, happiness and human well-being will surpass that of the days of King Solomon. God's sure word guarantees the benefits of this government for even the dead members of the human family, and by unswerving obedience towards the perfect governor Jesus Christ and toward Jehovah God they will receive the gift of everlasting life on the paradise earth. To see that government come in and enjoy its blessing without dying we have to prepare ourselves now before Armageddon by studying God's Word to see what his requirements are. 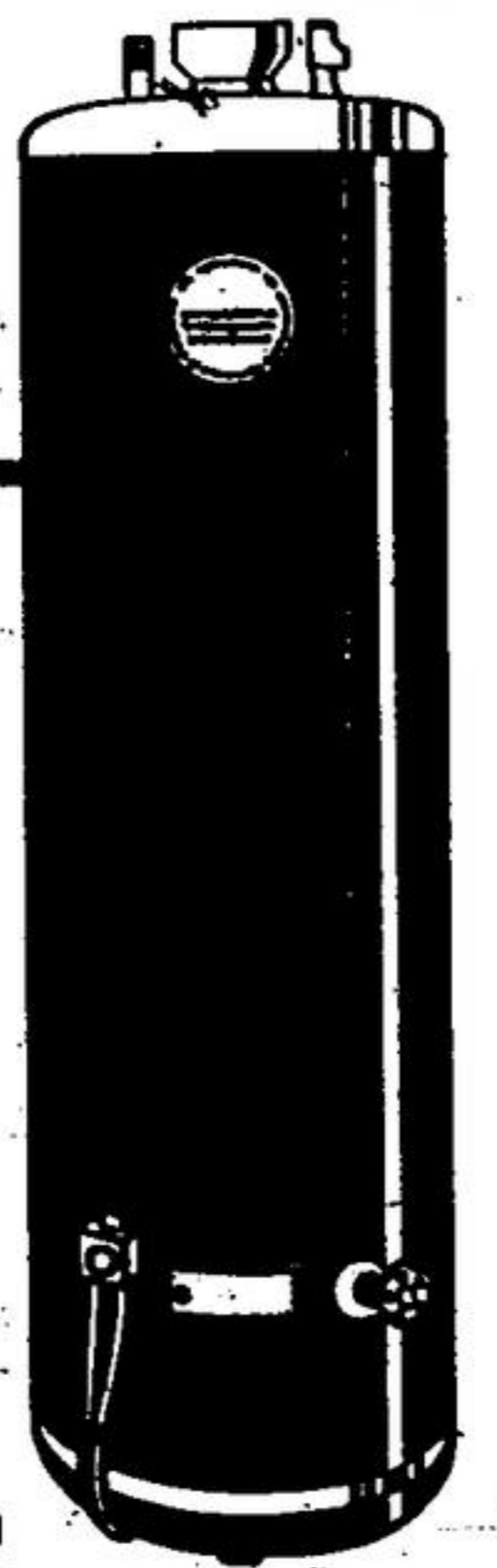
