Halton M.P. Suggests Pig Marketing Changes

A number of changes in the present government policies were suggested for pig production and marketing in Canada by Sandy Best, Halton M.P. in a speech delivered in the House of Commons on April 10th.

It is felt that a greater differentiation between A and B grades of hogs be made, and it is suggested that the present premium on B1 grades should be added to the premium now in effect on Grade A hogs, Mr. Best said. The advance registry system in Canada is now in a state of flux, he continued, partly due to increased interest in cross breeding and new breeds of swine. The advance registry station at Waterloo should be enlarged or a new station built, to accommodate the heavy demand for its facilities. It is extremely important to pursue our quality breeding stock and hog production program as American producers are improving the quality of their product, and this may in future place Canada in a difficult competitive position with regard to exports or internal markets.

For many years the export of pig products to Great Britain formed a substantial part of Canadian agricultural export trade. This market should now be re-examined most closely, Mr. Best believes, to reestablish trade with Great Britain in pig products, particularly bacon and ham.

The government's indication that it intends to leave the pork buying field this coming autumn, indicates wise planning, he concluded. The mention of deficiency payments and quotas could not regulate the exact number of hogs any individual could produce, but would have the effect of letting returns on those animals produced beyond a certain number find their natural level in a normal market.
