Parents View Progress Of Norval School Pupils

It was Parents' Night at Norval Public School on Wednesday evening, May 13 and despite inclement weather, there was a fine turnout of the adults to observe the work and progress of their children and to discuss with the teachers possible corrections and incentives that would lead to greater academic virtue. The three teachers met informally the parents as they arrived in their own rooms, and were kept busy from 7 o'clock until well after 9 with the interviews. Mrs. John Noble, principal of the Norval School, in addition to the regular round of Grades 5, 6 and 7 curricula, displayed woodwork and needlepoint that the children had accomplished in the senior room. Miss Bernice Rosewell, teacher in the Intermediate room which comprises the Grades 3, 4, and 5, emphasized on the walls of the room the artistic abilities of her pupils especially their designs of stain glass windows. In the Junior Room Mrs. Thomas CaScadden, teacher of Grades 1 and 2, presented on the walls of her room each pupil's conception of his own home as well as printing, spelling and elementary arithmetic.

After the observation part of the evening was over the Home & School met in the Senior Room under president Fred G. Fendley who opened the meeting with a prayer. The main topic of discussion was on the report brought in by a special committee to arrange an evening for the Grade 8 pupils who have been attending the Stewarstown public school this past year due to overcrowding in the Norval school. It was decided to have a presentation evening, on Thursday, June 25th for the 12 Grade pupils who "in absentia" during the course of 1958-1959 were educated elsewhere. The committee report was presented by Mrs. G. L. Royal and the other members of the committee were Mrs. Norman Fendley and Mrs. Ormie Carter. The report was accepted on motion of the Rev. J. E. Maxwell and Mrs. Bradbury Wright.

It was Mr. Fendley's final evening in the chair and, after fitting words of thanks and gratitude for the cooperation he had received, he called for the election of officers for the 1959-60 term. Mr. Fendley vacated the chair and Rev. G. L. Royal, school trustee, took over to receive the nominations of the evening. The following executive was declared elected after due processes by the act-

ing chairman: president, Mrs. Ormie Carter, vice presidents, Mrs. G. L. Royal and Mr. Tallak Kjaraldalen; Recording Secretary, Mrs. Iv an Reynolds; treasurer, Mrs. Bradbury Wright, Correspondence secretary, Mrs. Donald Murray. Refreshments were served by the ladies and a social half hour enjoyed by teachers and parents. There were 20 members in attendance at the meeting.
