**TWO REAR END COLLISIONS NO SERIOUS INJURY**

Cst William Bennett of the county detachment OPP estimated damage at approximately \$550 in a rear-end collision north of Milton on Sunday involving a 1953 Mercury driven by Donald Livingstone 101 Main St. north, Georgetown, and a 1959 GMC pickup truck driven by Robert Watkins of 189 Bronte St., Milton.

Both vehicles were east bound on No. 15 sideroad west of No. 25 highway when the truck collided with the rear of the Livingstone car. Cst Bennett estimated the damage at \$400 to Livingstone's car and \$150 to the front of the pickup. The time of the collision was approximately 3 p.m.

A rear-end collision on No. 7 highway just west of the Hollywood House damaged cars driven by Rudolph Andrist of 9 Pineview Ave., Toronto, and Kenneth Berceon of 52 Queen St. town, early Thursday morning May 21st.

The Berceon car suffered the brunt of the damage, about \$200 worth while damage to the Andrist car was an estimated \$150. The collision happened at about 8 a.m. and Cst Dave Hardy of the county OPP investigated.
