**Confirmation Class

Fifty nine candidates were confirmed on Sunday evening at St. George's Anglican Church when Bishop W. E. Bagnall administered the ancient church rite. It was the largest class to be confirmed in the history of the century-old parish. They will make their first communion this Sunday at 9:30 a.m.

Bishop's chaplain was Rev. John Rathbone, rector of St. Alban's. Glen Williams and servers were Frank Evis, Robert Evis and Michael Payne.

After the confirmation service, the bishop dedicated the new memorial doors on the tower, parish hall and sacristy entrances which were given to the church in memory of W. F. Bradley, who had been a devoted parishioner until his death.

Following the service the bishop presented certificates and signed many personal prayer books. The Daughters of the Church and the Woman's Auxiliary served refreshments in the parish hall. Mrs. Bagnall accompanied her husband on this visit to the parish.

**Knox Professor Guest
Minister, Union Church**

The Rev. Prof. Allan L. Farris, M.A., B.D., M.Th., was the guest minister at the 126th anniversary Services of Union Presbyterian Church on Sunday, May 31. A very large morning congregation heard Professor Farris speak on "The Lord of the Future" as he emphasized the final emancipation of man in heaven; and, in the evening, "Predestination", brought forward that peculiarly Presbyterian doctrine which is so maligned and distorted by its enemies. The emphasis fell on the "sameness" of predestination and salvation. Professor Farris stated that the attitude "Farris will be will be", was, in reality, a doctrine of Islam and had no place in the structure or belief of the Church of Jesus Christ. The supposed Predestination of this modern day is, in truth, rank heresy and a new understanding of the Scriptural Word was needed in order to restore this Biblical doctrine. Predestination must always be in terms of God's redemptive Will as He confronts man in sin. Man must react, respond, to his God, but, God does not depend on man for His continuing work. God is as it were "in the driver's seat always" and His mission to man in the Lord Jesus Christ does not succeed or fail because of man and what man does. Predestination is the Will of God at work in the world seeking man for the Kingdom.

Professor Farris was educated at the University of Saskatchewan and at Knox College, Toronto. After his ordination in 1945 he was appointed by the General Board of Missions, the Presbyterian Church in Canada, to be the Ordained Missionary at Trail, B.C. In 1949 he was called to the Bolton and Nashville charge in the Presbytery of West Toronto. Professor Farris went to Scotland and the University of Edinburgh

Bryden died leaving vacant not only the Principalship but also the Chair of Church History. At the General Assembly held in June 1952, Allan L. Farris was appointed to fill the Chair of Church History at Knox College and the Rev. Prof. J. S. Glen, Ph.D., to be Principal. Since that time Professor Farris has resided in the Leaside area of Toronto and performed his duties in the College.
