**Guelph Man Victim Of Three-Car Crash**

Frank Nadalin, 47, of Guelph, one of ten persons injured in a three car accident near Acton Sunday died in St. Joseph's Hospital, Guelph, early Monday morning of a fractured skull and internal injuries he suffered in the crash. Two others were seriously hurt, however, five were released from hospital after treatment.

The fatally injured man was a passenger in a car driven by Dino Simanato of Guelph when it collided head-on with a car driven by Carl Dietricks of Fenwick Ave., Toronto. The third car driven by Attilio Odorici, also of Guelph went off the highway and overturned in a ditch avoiding the other two cars.

Seriously injured and in St. Joseph's Hospital, Guelph, are Dietricks, with a fractured skull, broken thigh and broken left ankle, Dino Simanato with undetermined internal injuries. Released were Ermino Simanato, Amando Vadori, Enrico Celotti, Odorico Attilio and Roman Zardo, all of Guelph.

Provincial police said the accident occurred when one of the cars pulled out to the oncoming lane to pass another vehicle.
