

BRANCH LINE NEARS COMPLETION - One of the most difficult construction problems faced by Canadian National Railways' engineers in the building of a new 294-mile C.N.R. branch line to link mineral-rich Northern Quebec with the industrial areas of the province was the 400-foot bridge spanning the gorge of the Cran River. The bridge, 32 miles northwest of St. Felicien was constructed by the cantilever method. To transfer workers & materials to the opposite side of the deep gorge, a needlemast was erected to support a cableway similar to the breeches-buoy technique employed to transfer men between ships at sea.
