Any veteran who is confined to hospital due to a mental infirmity. may obtain their credit by apply ing to the Minister within one year of discharge from hospital.

Veterans who have used their reestablishment credit and who subsequently wish to apply for benefits under the VLA, may repay an amount equal to their credit to restore their eligibility for VLA assistance. Deadline for such repayment is Sept. 30, 1962.

When a veteran enters into a

contract under Veterans' Land Act (VLA), and the contract is terminated, he may apply, within one year of termination date, for his credit. less amount of VLA

Veterans who repay their credit for purpose of qualifying for VLA benefits and subsequently withdraw their applications, or their contracts are terminated, may have the amount they repaid returned in to them in cash, less value of any

Purposes for which credit may include acquisition, repair or modernization of a home, purchase of ess, puchase of a business or prowas vision of working capital for a business, the purchase of Veterans insurance or the payment of premiums under any annuity or pension plan operated by the government

> There has also been a proposal made to more than double loans available to war veteran farmers. to enlarge their farm holdings and equipment.
