Local Doctor Authors Family History Book

At Jowet's Grove, Bayfield, on July 5th, some 75 members of the Clan McAllister celebrated their 1959 gathering which was highlighted by various celebrants from Michigan and the Detroit district, as well as from London, Toronto, Galt, Brantford, Georgetown and many from Huron County.

The committee in charge of the picnic table did a wonderful job and had a sumptuous dinner to which the gathering did ample justice, followed by tea and coffee, ice cream and watermelon. Later on, some took a dip in the lake.

The business meeting was under the guidance of J. S. Edison McAllister of Galt, who recently was chosen vice president of his engineering company, Goldie McCullough. He substituted for his cousin, Robin McAllister as chairman and was assisted by a brother James, both farmers on the Parr Line, Zurich, where William, John, Sandy and Robert took up land about 1849.

Russel McAllister, descendant of Robert McAllister and Janet Cochran, was chosen from among the Toronto relatives as president to succeed Robin who was recently

incapacitated through unfortunate illness. Arthur McAllister, Georgetown was chosen as secretary treasurer. Other committees were elected and the next gathering was set for 1961 at the park in Stratford on the Avon river, near the famous Shakespearian theatre.

One of the highlights of the celebration was distribution of a neat booklet, "The Clan McAllister" which gives a fairly complete family history from 1842 until the present generation. This book, with generous assistance, was compiled over a period of seven years by Dr. Arthur McAllister, Georgetown, only living member of a large family of sons and daughters of John McAllister, one of the brothers who arrived by sailing vessel in the spring of 1842 from Scotland. His wife, Mary Scobie of Stanley Township, Huron, died suddenly in Georgetown in 1913.

BINGHAM FARM WILL BECOME SECOND DISTRICT GOLF CLUB

The John Bingham farm has been chosen as the site of a new golf and country club. The farm is located on the 10th Line, east of town with the Credit river forming the west boundary of the property.

One of America's foremost designers is preparing plans to transform this 175 acre property into a championship 18-hole course.

The Misses Bingham held a farm stock and equipment sale on May 15th. The transformation of this farm from a place of hard work by the Bingham family to a place of leisure for golfers is perhaps indicative of the times, the developers feel. People have more time nowadays for recreation and they are convinced there is a need for a full 18-hole course in this area.

The property commands a fine view of the Credit valley and of the town. A combination of an ideal location, clean rolling terrain and fine wooded valleys will make a scenic course. Some of the fairways will skirt the beautiful river.

Claude Emerson, who has managed the Bingham farm for many years, is staying on under the employ of the new club. Local help will be employed as extensively as possible in the development. Construction of greens will start this week. Harvey Adamson of Eriandale is the construction superintendent.
