The Ontario Safety League has appointed Judy Adams as Co-ordinator of Home Safety, in a stepped-up program to reduce accidents in the home. Initially, special emphasis is to be given to educating mothers in the safe handling of plastic bags, which have brought death by suffocation to a number of young children.

"Plastic film can be deadly to young children — but only if improperly handled by adults" says F. H. Ellis, General Manager of the Ontario Safety League. "Babies who sleep on cribs covered with this plastic, or toddlers who are allowed to play with plastic bags are in peril. Statistics show us that plastic is very low on the list of home hazards, but we cannot be content until the danger has been eliminated completely. This will be achieved as soon as all parents realize that plastic bags should be kept away from children and destroyed when they have served
