usefulness! Ordinary dirt can be removed from stainless steel pots and pans with plain soap and water, or by soaking before washing. For more stubborn deposits, or burned on-food, add baking soda to the water or use a paste made with ammonia and water and a fine

scouring powder. POLISHING LINES A cloth, sponge or fibre pad should be used for cleaning and the pan should be rubbed in the direction of the polishing lines of the metal.

Stainless steel wool pads or sponges are available in many houseware and hardware out lets. Regular steel wool and soap pads are not recommended, since a tiny particle left Inside a pan may rust unless followed by careful ringing.
