**Milton Fair Has 319 Cattle in Three Breed Shows There**

The Halton Jersey, Holstein, and Guernsey breeders staged one of the largest dairy breed shows in several years. Exhibitors from the three breeds showed a total of 319 head in the three shows at Milton Fair. Exhibitors in the Holstein "County Black and White Day" exhibited 132 animals. In close competition Ashville Farm Limited was awarded both the Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor awards.

The grand champion male was exhibited by Alluvialdale Farms, on their entry Spring Farm Fords. The Grand Champion Female award went to Miss Barbara Y. Rowle, on Twin Rivers Sovereign Kate. The judge for the Holstein show was Wallace Knapp.

Jersey breeders exhibited 85 animals before Judge Frank Stenger, of Ennisville. The Premier Breeder award went to Kenneth Ella and Sons, of Horby. The Premier Exhibitor award was given to Mac Alexander & Sons, Norval.

The Grand Champion Male was exhibited by Mr. and Mrs. M. W. Staples, with their entry Edgela Dreamer Tidy. The Senior Championship Female was awarded to Mr. and Mrs. W. Staples, with their entry Village Beacon's Daisy.

The Halton and Peel Guernsey breeders held their largest show to date, with 102 head being exhibited. The Premier Breeder award was given to Malcolm T. McNabb & Sons, and the Premier Exhibitor award went to J. L. Chisholm.

The Grand Champion male was College Adonis, exhibited by Fraser T. McNabb; and the entry of Jos. M. Pigott, Lazy Pat Mavoureen, was awarded the Grand Champion female.

Though the boys did not fare so well game wise or score wise, the club figures they did very well for their entrance into organized lacrosse. The team went down to a defeat in the first game 14 to 1, the victors being a very strong team from St. Catharines. Their second game was won by default as the Newmarket team failed to show. Their final game at 8 p.m. was wrapped up by the Huntsville 11-0. This team went on in a game immediately after to out Elora for the consolation trophy. The grand championship was decided when a real power house team from Toronto township defeated the Alderwood Club in overtime.

The calibre of lacrosse played was something terrific when you take into consideration the fact that most of these towns start the youngsters playing at the age of five, they have strong backing and both good floored arenas and outside bowls. "I think our boys did very well. They never gave up trying."

I would like to take this opportunity to give you a summary of this club's origination and activities for this season. It was first started rolling when a group of men from Georgetown interested in the sport itself and also liking to work with the boys decided to have a meeting. A set of 20 regulation lacrosse shoulder pads were bought for the boys.

After this expense we decided to move to the Glen, where Mr. Joe Eason donated the use of the cushion he erected last year. Thanks, Joe! Some work was needed to be done so once again all hands chipped in, this time with hammer and nails.

Mid season a draw was held to raise funds. A set of new sweaters were obtained for the Dixie tournament. I would also like here to thank the Canadian Legion Branch 120 for the use of sweaters for a couple of exhibition games.

Although this column has appeared at different times under Community Centre headings, I would like to know we are an independent club known as the Georgetown Minor Lacrosse Club and are neither affiliated with nor responsible to any other organization.

It is hoped next year the club will expand and organize from juvenile down to novice. A lot more help will be required in coaching, etc., so please watch for an announcement to be made of the first meeting in early spring.

Having had the privilege of serving as chairman of this club in the year of its origin I would like to thank its members who are Roy Norton, Sr., Herb Robinson, Shel Lawr, Gerald Perkins, Harold Bairdow, Roy Snell, Jerry Morgan, Pete Miller, Doug Townsend, Bud and Bill Hayes, and Roy Norton Jr., who gave so freely of their time to work with these boys this season.
