Speaking of Col. McCrae, a very wonderful eulogy of our famed Guelph poet, doctor, soldier of the first war appeared about a year ago in an American-printed magazine, for the Rotary International. It was we believe we are safe in saying, the most complete and interesting story of the gallant author of "Flanders Fields" we have ever read. It traced his career from his days as a civilian doctor through the horrors of a front line surgeon with the Canadian Corps, and his almost unbelievable fame upon the publishing (in England) of his verse, to the final days of tragedy as a doctor who refused to rest, and finally succumbed to pneumonia brought on through overwork in his duties, and refusal to leave the troops he

had learned to admire and like so well. However, as long as his immortal words of "Flanders Fields" exist, he will live on as the symbol of all the sacrifice and horror of the holocaust of trench warfare in 1914-1918.

At present there is quite a movement on foot to arrange another pilgrimage to the battlefields of Europe, and we should judge, if it becomes reality, a large number will be interested in going along. This has been mooted for many years now, but we should not be surprised to see it take place in the not too distant future.
