Lions Club Bids Farewell to Past President Miller

The Lions Club regular dinner meeting took the form of a farewell party, Tuesday, September 15, as one hundred Lions and their ladies as well as district, Canadian and International officers assembled to say farewell to the immediate past president, Dick Miller and Mrs. Miller prior to their move

to Stoney Creek. During supper in the Legion Hall, president Ernie Alcott welcomed the members and ladies, and the numerous guests including International councillor Russ Vickers and Mrs. Vickers of Burlington, International director Bob Cooper and Mrs. Cooper, Brampton, district publicity relations chairman Al Smith and Mrs. Smith of Ancaster, Canadian secretary George Winnett of Oakville and Deputy District Governor Vern Stetler and Mrs. Stetler of Erindale. The gala evening was doubly special since it also marked a visit from District Governor George Laughlin of St. Catharines. Following remarks by the president on the mark made in Lionism by the departing Mr. Miller over the past sixteen years and the circle of friends made by the past president and his wife, Don Barrager presented them with an engraved tea service from the club as a token of remembrance and appreciation.

In thanking the club Mr. Miller said that they leave town with many fond memories of some fine times and associations during the past four years and especially thanked the district officers and club executive for the 100 per cent cooperation given him during his term as president last year. The balance of the evening was spent in dancing as the club bid farewell to the well liked couple.
