Huttonville, Snelgrove to Get Dial Phones Next Year

Dial telephone service will come to Huttonville, Snelgrove and Victoria next October. Customers will have Lloyd G. Denby, manager of the Bell Telephone Company for this area announced recently.

The program calls for the construction of dial exchange buildings at Snelgrove and Victoria by next Spring and the extension of the switching equipment in the present Brampton dial office.

Contract for the Snelgrove office has already been let to Carroll Contracting Company of Toronto and work started in October. The contract for the Victoria building will be decided on sometime this month and work will start in December.

With the changeover to dial, the three areas will be served by exchanges having standard two-letter, five figure numbers. The exchange name and number will be UNION 5 for Huttonville, VINEWOOD 3 for Snelgrove and TEMPLE 8 for Victoria customers.

Largest of the three dial installations will be at Snelgrove where some 1,200 terminals — each terminal corresponding to a telephone line — will be provided. The Victoria office will be equipped with 600 terminals while an estimated 300 terminals will be needed to serve Huttonville area.

These exchanges are designed so that additional terminals can be easily provided when required. Mr. Denby said.

It is pointed out that dial service will be provided between the three new dial offices and the Brampton exchange of GEORGETOWN 1, but the introduction of dial service would necessitate some changes to the present boundaries of the three exchange areas.

The first boundary change is scheduled for April 1960, when a section of the Huttonville area will become part of the Brampton office. Customers within an area lying south of highway 7 and in concessions two and three will be given Glendale 1 numbers at that time.

Coincident with the introduction of dial service in October, three further boundary changes will be made. The Huttonville exchange of UNION 5 will be within a boundary of highway 7 on the north to the base line on the south, and from concession 6 on the West to concession 3.

Crown Attorney Orders Juvenile Smoking Check

Persons under the age of sixteen will have a fine slapped on them if caught smoking or in the possession of tobacco by police from now on.

Crown Attorney Peter McWilliams in a directive to chief constables this week ordered all police departments to crack

down on Chapter 286 of the Revised Statutes of Canada 1952, known as the Tobacco Restraint Act.

The act provides against any juvenile smoking or chewing tobacco in a street or public place or purchasing or having in his possession cigarettes or cigarette papers or tobacco in any form.

Any person who sells, gives or furnishes any of the same to juveniles will be liable to maximum fines of \$10 to first offenders, \$25 to second offenders, and \$100 to third offenders.

Juvenile offenders may be questioned under oath as to where the tobacco was obtained.

Rachlin Retires From Acton Municipal Scene

Acton politics, if I may use that word, is in my blood. I don't think I will ever be able to dismiss it from my everyday thoughts. But the time has come for me to ease up physically. I find it impossible to continue in council and still look after my business, and give to each the time it deserves," with this statement at conclusion of his 40-minute report to Acton rate payers, Thursday night, finance chairman, Councillor Ben Rachlin declined nominations as majority candidate, with thanks to his sponsors.

An Acton merchant, Mr. Rachlin is the son of a former Georgetown man, the late Isaac Rachlin who operated a dry cleaning business here several years ago.

Before announcing his retirement from active participation in municipal affairs, Mr. Rachlin in a detailed financial report, unveiled an achievement reflecting credit on council generally, and in particular, its finance chairman. Council began this term with a staggering \$52,000 deficit. Unless something unforeseen happens it will finish 1959 only about \$5000 in the red.

This decrease, Councillor Rachlin explained was the result of a levying a higher tax rate, and also a direct result of practising economy in all council departments. He also disclosed for the first time in five years there is no bank indebtedness on the current account.
