

### 6 Oakville Juveniles Rapped for Smoking

"Juveniles who don't get along in school are the first to make themselves feel important by smoking," Magistrate Langdon said today as he reprimanded six Oakville juveniles who pleaded guilty to violations of the Federal Tobacco Restriction Act.

Magistrate Langdon serves as a judge in Juvenile Court.

The three boys and three girls were convicted of smoking. The act prohibits anyone under the age of 16 years from using tobacco in any form. It provides for a reprimand on the first conviction, a \$1 fine on the second and a \$4 fine for the third and subsequent offenses.

It was the first time Judge Langdon has permitted press coverage of juvenile court. He said he allowed the press to attend the hearing in the hope that the public would become more aware of the act.

"The court is further concerned that these students will not be satisfied with tobacco and will soon try something stronger that will become a serious habit," the judge said. "You have been brought to court today in order that your parents and you will know that you are not entitled to use cigarettes when you are under 16."
