Clifford (Tim) Stacey Scout Leader, War Vet

Funeral service was held in St. George's Anglican Church on Saturday for Clifford (Tim) Stacey, 68 who died suddenly on November 25th at his home, 8 Draper St.

The service was conducted by Rev. Kenneth Richardson, with interment following in Greenwood Cemetery. The pallbearers were former scouts Charlie Davis, Jack Watson, Paul Prust, rover scouts Tom Forgrave and Francis Hulme and rover leader Howard Harper. Scarborough, Scouters formed a guard of honour at the church.

Mr. Stacey was born in Beetley, Norfolk, England and came to Canada with his parents in 1912.

He joined the army in August 1914 at Milton and served overseas till 1919, with the Royal Canadian Horse Artillery.

In 1917 he married the former Florence Godly, and returned to Canada in 1919, settling in Brookville. Since 1920 he lived in Georgetown.

For 12 years he was Scoutmaster at St. George's and since then had continued to be interested in Scouting, serving on the group committee of St. John's United Church.

In 1940 he joined the Veteran Guards and was discharged in 1945. Until his retirement 3 years ago he was employed at the Alliance Paper Mill.

He was a Charter member of Branch 120 Canadian Legion, a member of the Originals Club, an Oddfellow for 37 years and a Rebekah.

He was an Anglican, a member of St. George's Church.

He is survived by his wife Florence Godly and a daughter Joyte, Mrs. T. Hayward, Guilph.

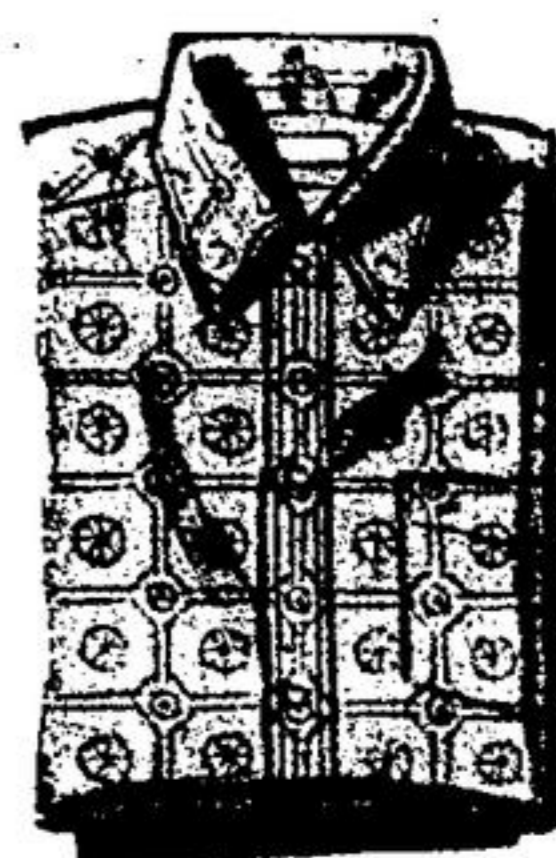
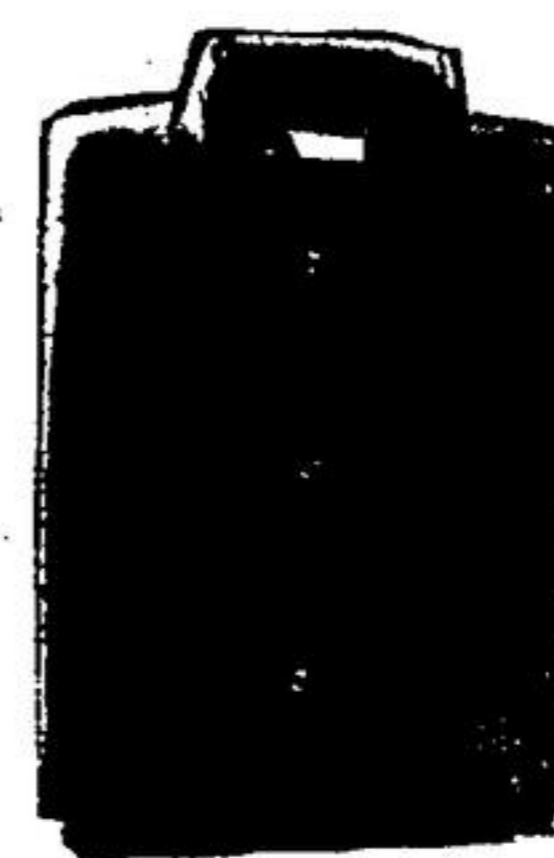
