

Oswald Warman, Herdsman Was Known Across Country

Oswald Warman, a herdsman for 47 years with B. H. Bull and Son and one of the best known figures in the Jersey cattle business died Tuesday, Nov. 24. "He was known from coast to coast," said John Bull. "There hasn't been a top show in Canada or the United States in which he hadn't shown. All the top breeders of the continent knew Oswald."

Born in Wiltshire, England, Mr. Warman started showing Jerseys with his uncle at the age of 14 years. Showing at most of the prominent fairs in England, he showed grand champion bull and grand champion cow at the Royal County Show at Maidstone, England.

In 1912, he was persuaded by Duncan Bull, John's father and by Col. Bartley Bull to come to Canada as herdsman for the Brampton Jerseys. Since that day to the time of his death he was top herdsman at B. H. Bull and Son—a total of 47 years.

"Oswald had a tremendous influence on Jersey breeding in Canada. The real down-to-earth farmers all respected his judgment," said John Bull. "He was above all a developer of good Jersey cattle and an excellent herdsman."

Mr. Warman's first job with the Bull Estate when he came to Canada in 1912 was to prepare Jerseys for the Canadian National Exhibition. That year he showed the grand champion bull and won the grand championship.

Mr. Warman also showed the grand old show cow, Lady Viola, a picture of whose head is used by the American Jersey Cattle Club and is the trade mark of the Canadian Jersey Cattle Club.

Among his numerous other achievements, he was herdsman in 1936 when B. H. Bull and Son had by far the largest Jersey herd in the world with up to 1,100 purebred cattle. He also helped develop Brampton East, the world's record butterfat cow for a number of years. Until this year, when all health hampered his activities, he had either showed or been a spectator at the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair since its inception. Similarly, with the CNE, with the exception of this year, he had visited it each year since 1912.

One of Mr. Warman's sons, Bruce, has been with B. H. Bull and Son for the past 16 to 17 years.

He is survived by his wife, the former Ellen Poole; three sons, Bruce of Brampton, Percy who is a Jersey farmer and Douglas who is with the Swift Canadian Co. in Toronto, and a daughter, Eileen (Mrs. E. B. Hastlow) of Waterloo. He is also survived by 11 grandchildren.

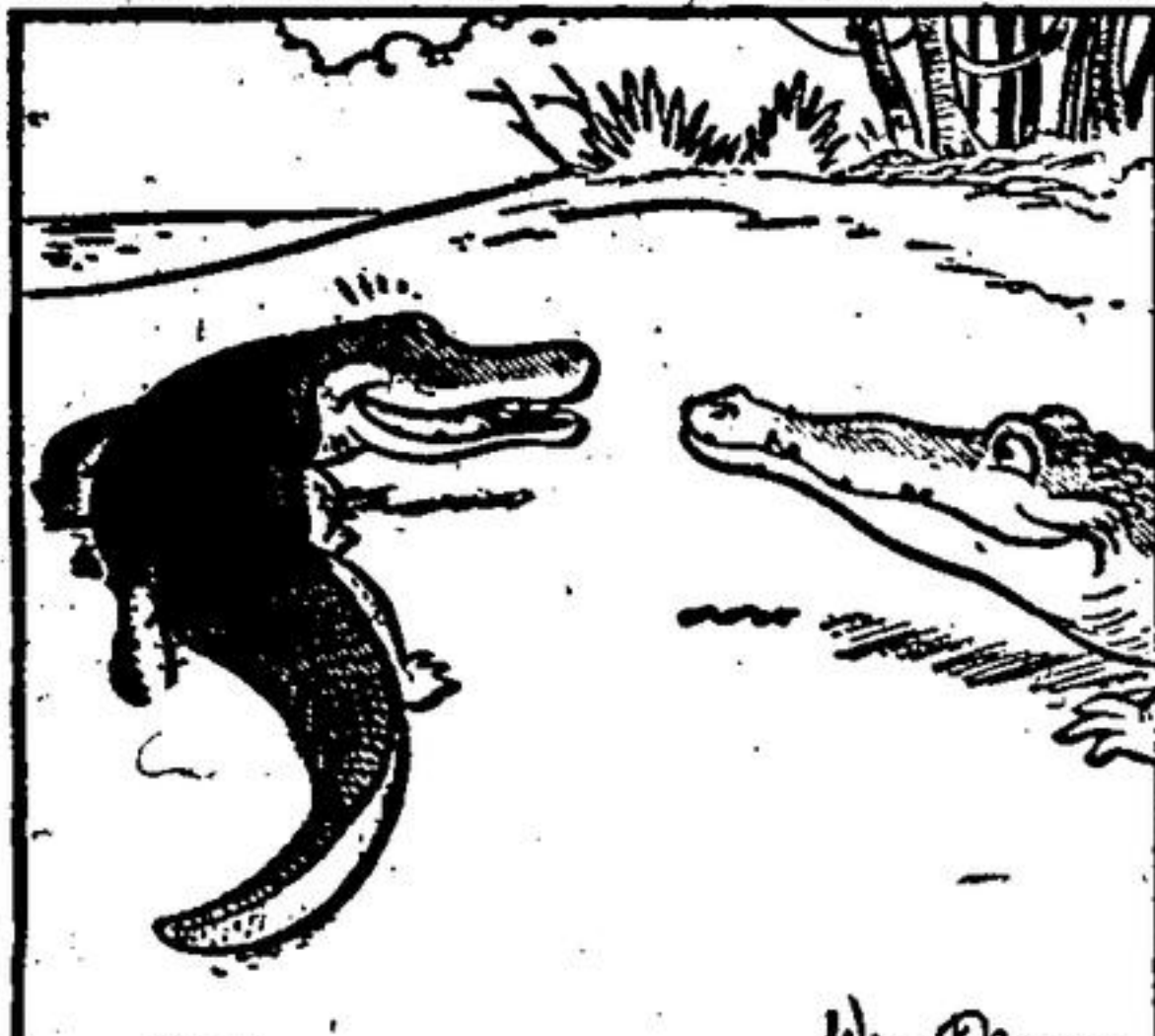
