

HERE TILL ROADS ARE BETTER RATEPAYER PROMISES COUNCIL

"I'll be at every council meeting as long as the condition exists," promised George Mundy, 21 Stevens Crescent, requesting a council on Monday for action on fixing roads in his part of the Delrex subdivision.

Residents of Lower Slobovia, as he terms his area, are the "forgotten ones" in town, he said. He was assured at a council meeting a few weeks ago that action would be taken, but nothing has yet been done, he continued.

Mr. Mundy said it was not fair to area residents who pay town taxes not to have passable roads, and that whether a third party is responsible or not for road work, he wants action.

Road chairman Walter Gray promised some action, though admitting that grading is difficult at this time of the year.

Asked by Cr. Hyde if the matter had been discussed with the subdivider, Mr. Gray said that it had and they are doing what they can.

The area is under an agreement, part of which calls for road maintenance, Cr. Harrison said, and council decided two weeks ago to ask action from the subdivider, otherwise "the town would do the work and bill him."

It is council's responsibility to take action, said Cr. Hyde, and not up to residents to see the developer. His suggestion that a letter be sent to Delrex Developments pointing out that they are responsible, was okayed by council.

Later in the meeting the subdivision road question came up again, with reading of a letter from Delrex Developments asking specific town requirements for acceptance of roads by the municipality.

The letter pointed out that in the original agreement with the town, graded and gravelled roads were required, but type of construction was not specified, nor was there any obligation to maintain roads for any

given number of years. There was controversy about taking over roads in the first stage of the Delrex area and the firm wishes to avoid a repetition of this, the letter continued. In fact, the firm did considerable work above its obligations and "recent statements in council indicate that this has been misinterpreted as an admission of responsibility" Delrex claims.

The Delrex firm objects to snow removal and ice control as part of road maintenance and is of the opinion this is the sole responsibility of the town, the letter concluded.

General agreement was expressed by councilors that winter control is the town's responsibility.

The matter of road requirements has already been explained to Delrex engineer G. R. Bligh said, when questioned by Cr. Harrison, and it was agreed that another copy of the Dept. of Highways requirements for taking over subdivision roads would be sent to Delrex Developments.
