### McMenemy Resigns Post

Resignation of Robert McMenemy from Georgetown Planning Board and the Committee of Adjustment was accepted with regret by council on Monday.

Mr. McMenemy, in a letter, said demands of his job and other activities had caused his decision. He has been a planning board member since the inception of the board, and only that evening had been

named as one of the members of the adjustment committee which will deal with matters affecting zoning. Ontario Department of Planning approval was received Monday for appointment of Claude Kenton and Irwin Noble to one-year terms on the new committee; Mr. McMenemy for a 2-year term; and Harold Baird, a 3-year term. A replacement must now be found for Mr. McMenemy.

### Mrs. Joseph Armstrong Native of Georgetown

A Georgetown native, Mrs. Joseph Armstrong, 45 Shelley St., died in St. Joseph's Hospital, Guelph on December 9th. She was in her 71st year. The former Alice Maude Boomer, she was the daughter of the late John and Alice McAndrew Boomer and had lived all her life in town with the exception of three years spent in Detroit, Michigan. Before her marriage in April, 1916 she was employed at the Alliance Paper Mill, working on what was known as the "old plater." She was a member of St. George's Anglican Church and at one time had taken an active part in the Daughters of the Church group.

Surviving are her husband, two children, Fred, RR 3 and Helen, two granddaughters, and sisters Misses Lettie and Cecily Boomer and Mrs. Fred Armstrong, Sr., of town. A brother John Boomer died in Toronto two years ago.

### Accident Victim is Making Good Progress

Mrs. Robert French, 114 Raylawn Crescent, injured in a highway crash last week in which two men were killed, is making good progress to recovery in Peel Memorial Hospital, Brampton.

She suffered a broken leg and head injuries when a car driven by a neighbour, Douglas Kennedy, was in collision with one driven by William Wright, Brampton, on No. 7 highway three miles east of Norval. Both drivers were killed in the crash.

A report of the accident, hurriedly gathered as the Herald went to press last Wednesday morning, erred in saying that Mr. Kennedy's car skidded in front of the other vehicle. According to a police report received later, Mr. Wright's car was apparently crosswise on the highway and was struck in the side by Mr. Kennedy as he rounded a curve in the road, homebound from work in Weston. Both vehicles were completely demolished in the crash.

Funeral service was conducted in Holy Cross R.C. Church on Friday morning for Douglas Joseph Kennedy, 33 of 112 Raylawn Crescent, victim of a highway crash on Tuesday. Father Thomas Van Laer conducted the service.

A resident of town for a year, he was an employee of the Rock Drill Rod Co., Weston. He was a native of Riehton, Lancashire, England, coming to Canada four years ago with his wife and family. They lived in Rexdale before moving to Georgetown.

He leaves his wife, the former Margaret Mitchell, two children, Roy and Susan; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Edward Kennedy of Riehton; a sister, Mrs. Thomas Waterhouse of Great Harwood and four brothers, Harry, Roland, Keith and Kevin of Riehton.

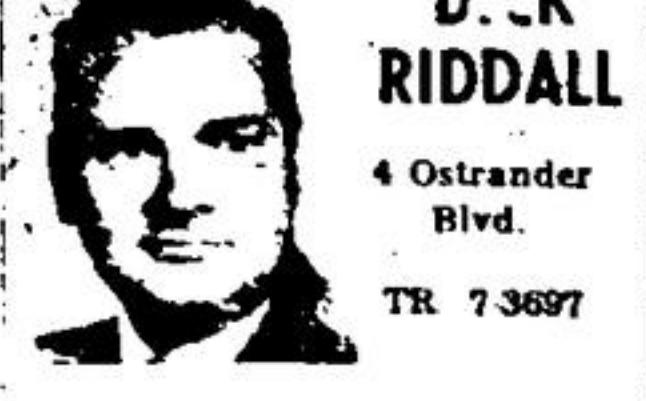
