Cars Kill Deer Prisoners Happy

Two deer killed in auto accidents this week brought the total destroyed on the highways to 10 since the first of November. Halton game warden R. M. Reid reported this week.

One died Friday on the Guelph Line a mile north of Campbellville when it collided with a car driven by a Guelph man, causing \$250 damage to the car. Another met its fate and gave Cornelius Flipse of Acton a \$500 dent in the fender on highway 7 just west of Acton on Sunday.

The deer killed at Acton will not be mourned in one place, at least. It will be used to provide a venison Christmas dinner for Halton county jail prisoners at Milton, the game warden said.

OPP Report On Holiday Accidents

Motor vehicle accidents Christmas Eve took OPP to the Number 10 sideroad at Norva, and the 7th line north of No. 7 Hwy.

Damage was estimated at \$850 in the Norval smash which occurred at about 8:15 p.m. John Spence of 8 Keats St. was driving west on the line when his car skidded off the road and clipped off a hydro pole. Replacement Cst. Connor of the Milton detachment OPP made the investigation.

Two hours later Cst. Ray Anderson of the same detachment investigated a rear end collision just north of the Ballinafad curve where cars driven by Henry Gerds of Pointe Claire,
