

Penalty Box Busy As Dunville Beats Glen

Dunville Mudcats avenged a 1-3 setback administered by the Glen in a pre-Christmas encounter last Wednesday night when they rolled to an 11-6 decision over the GW's bars, in Intermediate C hockey action.

The game took close to an extra half hour to complete after both clubs tried to chase the puck and broke the momentum with sticks and fists. Aggressive activities cost both teams heavily and the penalty box in the last half of the 3rd period looked like a telephone booth on a rainy day.

Dunville scored twice in the first period and counted tallies three and four early in the second session before the Glen started to get their shots on target.

Judge picked an open carry for a solo thrust at the Glen goal that brought them within one tally of tying it. Nick Ferri from Joe Schettl at 8:1 and Webster on a pass from Max Stafford at 10:48 made it 4-3 with half a game to go.

Dunville upped their lead again at 15:12 before Ferri netted his second of the night with help from John Haines 40 seconds later.

Ferri was off for playing with the Mudcats' stick when the Mudcats notched their sixth goal at 17:58. They made it 7-4 with

just three seconds left in the period.

A Dunville goal at the 20 second mark of the third went unanswered until 4:47 when a Haines pass to Bobby Hall elicited for a Glen score. Dunville piled two more in at 9:32 and 10:56 to put it beyond reach.

Robertson managed the Glen's 6th goal on an unassisted effort at 11:45 but Dunville capped the scoring at 16:50.

The Glen plays host to the Dunville again next Wednesday night after a game in Dunville tomorrow (Friday) night, and take on Fort Erie at bordertown on the 23rd.

CONSTRUCTION ON THE extension of the Nova Scotia Hotel in Halifax is progressing rapidly. Stone and brick work of the big, 11-story CNR structure is almost completed. The new wing will more than double the capacity of the hotel to 377 rooms. Scheduled for completion in mid-1960, the addition will make the CNR Nova Scotia the largest hotel east of Quebec. Public rooms for conventions and meetings will be enlarged to accommodate 600 persons at banquet and 600 at meetings. The extended ballroom will handle 450 persons at banquets and 650 at meetings. For the first time it will be possible to handle large convention groups from other parts of Canada and the United States at Halifax.

Archbishop Clark Canon in Jerusalem

Most Rev. Howard H. Clark, Primate of the Anglican Church of Canada and Archbishop of Edmonton, has been made honorary Canon of Pisgah, Jerusalem, Canon A. H. Davis, General Secretary of the Church's Missionary Society announced here today. The canonry was formally held by Most Rev. Walter P. Barfoot, Archbishop of Rupert's Land, who relinquished it upon his retirement from the Canadian primacy in 1959.

As Canon of Pisgah, Archbishop Clark is accorded a stall in the Collegiate Church of St. George the Martyr. Four other leading Anglicans are also Canons of Pisgah, one of whom is Most Rev. A. C. Lichtenberger, Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church in the United States.

The Jerusalem Archdiocese which was established in 1841 became the responsibility of the worldwide Anglican communion in 1954. The Canadian Church through its Missionary Society, contributes financially to its upkeep.

The Archdiocese covers a huge area of the Middle East, including Iran, Egypt, Libya, Sudan, Jordan, Lebanon and Syria, each of which is administered by a Bishop. The present Archbishop is Most Rev. Angus C. MacInnes, whose headquarters are in Jerusalem. The Collegiate Church of St. George the Martyr has the status of a Cathedral, but the title is not assumed.

The Anglican Church in addition to representing Christianity in the Middle East, ministers to seven Arab congregations numbering about 1,000 souls, serves English-speaking businessmen, diplomats, oil workers, etc., carries out an extensive mission to seamen, and is particularly active in work among refugees. One of the Bishops within the Archdiocese is an Arab, Rt. Rev. Najib Cuhain, Bishop of the Diocese of Jordan, Lebanon and Syria.

Other business included the first sewing school, the first session being at Mrs. Leo Jamieson's on Jan. 13th and also the family night and pot luck supper which will also be at the Jamieson's home on Feb. 6th. The members also decided to have a series of euchres in their homes again.
