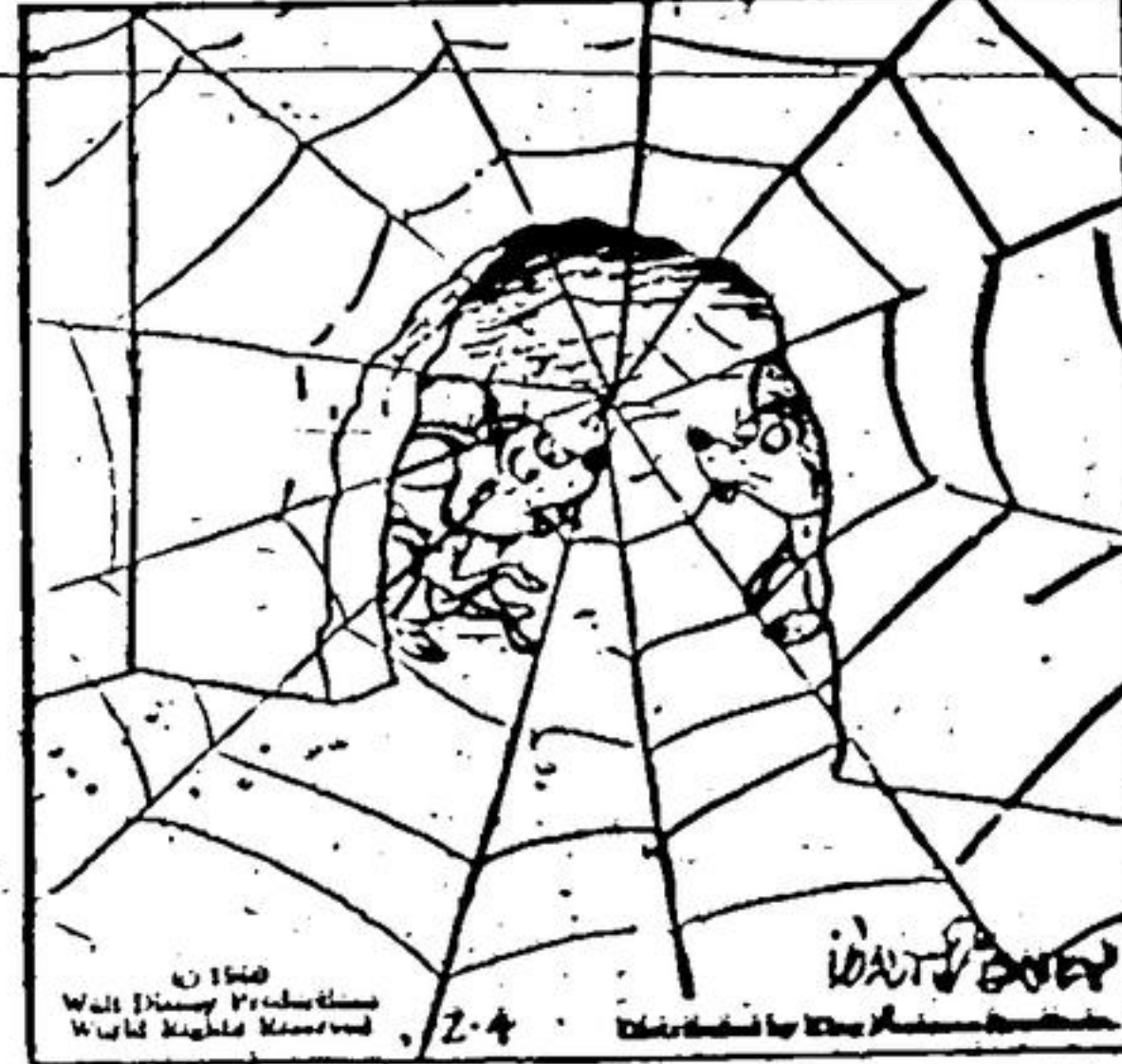

Halton Liberals in Hamilton To Hear Hon. Paul Martin

Many Halton county Liberals attended the southern Ontario Liberal Association convention held on Saturday at the Fether Hotel in Hamilton when the Hon. Paul Martin was guest speaker at the evening banquet.

Mr. Martin, who is an eloquent speaker not only attacked the government on the promises they have failed to fulfil but said the Liberal opposition was ready to offer constructive ideas so that the farmers and unemployed would not have to suffer if the government would put them into motion. "What would we have done today if it had not been for the policies of the Liberal party in social security, with 750,000 people unemployed in Canada at the present time," said Mr. Martin.

He said the fortunes of the Liberal party were at a low ebb after the 1957 elections, but that they were returning more rapidly than expected, due to the terrific increase of the national debt, the tight money policy, housing and the increased unemployment. He said Mr. Diefenbaker promised that no one would suffer if he was elected to office but a look at the figures of the unemployed, and the complete reversal on the farm question from support prices to deficiency payments.
