Add 410 New Telephones In Georgetown Last Year

The expansion of telephone facilities in Georgetown during 1959 was typical of the situation across the territory served by The Bell Telephone Company of Canada, it was revealed in that company's 80th annual report issued this week. Last year's telephone construction program of \$196 million was the largest in the company's history. The report states, and 190,328 telephones were added to those in service. On the local scene, some 410 telephones were added. L. G. Denby, Bell manager for this region, said, bringing the total to 4180 as of December 31st. According to the report, net income totalled \$50,283,578 for last year, \$11,384,289 higher than in 1958. Earnings per share amounted to \$2.48 or 33 cents higher than in the previous year. The quarterly dividend of 50 cents per share was increased to 65 cents for the final quarter and surplus was increased by \$9,107,845. Greater customer use of our services was accompanied in 1959 by an improvement in our earnings. Thus W. Eadie, president, emphasized in the report. Revenues increased by 14.5 per cent, due mainly to greater use of our services. With concerted efforts to improve productivity, we were able to limit the increase in operating costs to only seven per cent, a smaller rise than during any other year in the post-war period.
