**Church Services Planned For Anglicans in Delrex**

The 105 Anglican families in Delrex will soon have their own church services in their area.

With growth of the town and consequent growth in attendance at St. George's Church, the Bishop of Niagara, the Rt. Rev. Walter E. Bagnall, has been concerned about the church's place in this growing part of town. An auxiliary church school was first started, meeting in a vacant facility on the highway through courtesy of Delrex Developments, and later when this was leased by Standard Products, through courtesy of the manager, Ted Englehart. The need is now seen for more formal services, for parents as well as for children.

A week from Sunday, arch 20th, will be the first service, a family eucharist which will begin at 9 a.m. and last about 45 minutes. Following this parents will have a half-hour coffee period while the children meet for teaching. The facilities lend themselves for this type of family service, and there is ample parking facilities.

The rector of St. Alban's, Glen Williams, the Rev. John D. Rathbone has been appointed priest in charge of this extension work. The Georgetown rector, Rev. Kenneth Richardson, who is also rural dean of Halton is in overall charge of Anglican families in Georgetown.
