Chamber Of Commerce Urges Examination Of Tax Structure

The Executive Council of The [unintelligible] like the present Canadian Chamber of Commerce today recommended that the federal government undertake a thorough examination of the entire Canadian tax structure without delay "including the revenue sources and needs of all levels of government."

In a pre-budget brief to the Ministers of Finance and National Revenue, the Chamber's Executive Council said the present tax system has grown up over the years under the impact of successive annual reviews designed primarily to meet immediate needs "so one can say what is its real evidence, what are its effects on savings and incentives; what are the anomalies it perpetuates in security markets, or how it contributes to careless and wasteful business practices." It was stated, "A detailed review of the entire philosophy behind it is long overdue."

The brief went on to say that in view of the present conditions 1960 does not seem to offer a good opportunity for easing the overall burden of taxation. "If revenues prove sufficiently buoyant, it would seem preferable to proceed with a careful program of debt reduction instead. This would help to restore the balance between saving and investment and to reduce our dependence on foreign capital," it was stated.

As one means of decreasing Canada's dependence on foreign capital, the brief urged the government to seek means of increasing the rate of Canadian saving. In this connection, careful control of government expenditure and the orderly repayment of government debt

"The Council does feel, however, that it is important to avoid any appearance of excessively rigid attitudes in the face of seasonal needs or untoward developments. The authorities should — certainly be prepared to shift policy promptly if conditions change. On the one hand a significant increase of inflationary pressures would undoubtedly require, along with other countermeasures, some intensification of monetary restraint. On the other hand a distinct downturn in the economy would normally make an expansion of the money supply advisable."

Among other things, the brief said —

"The Chamber welcomes the recent announcement that the government intends to establish a Royal Commission along the lines of the U.S. Hoover Commission — to recommend means of running government affairs more efficiently. It is important to realize that the objectives of such a Royal Commission should include economy as well as efficiency," said the brief. "Beneficial results should stem from this study if these objectives are effectively pursued, and the Chamber assures the government of its firm support in this endeavour."

There should be a careful re-examination of the continued high exchange value of the Canadian dollar.

The moderate expenditures involved in a well-organized industrial training program for the unemployed in which industry should be invited to cooperate would be justified because they would contribute to a stronger and more productive economy.

A surveillance of markets

and trading practices will be increasingly important in the period ahead due to developments in Europe and elsewhere.

The Executive Council, it was stated, "respectfully suggests that consideration be given to broadening the present definition of capital items eligible for export credit guarantees."

The brief also reiterated a number of specific recommendations regarding the Income Tax Act, the Excise Tax Act, the Estate Tax Act and the Customs Act which had been presented to the Ministers by letter at the end of 1959.
