Durham Sleight Ride Has Unhappy Ending

Reporting an accident to a Georgetown man, the Durham Chronicle gives an account of a sleight ride party which had a sad ending. "It was my first sleight ride party" said Joan Laidler. "I'd always wanted to have one but I don't think I'll ever have another." Four months ago Howard and Joan Laidler moved from Toronto to the Ball Christie farm north of Halton. They have two boys, a girl, 3, and a boy 5. Howard is employed with the hydro in the Brampton district. They used to live at Georgetown where Joan played in the 'Girls' Pipe Band. (She is the former Joan MacDonnell.) They had never seen snow such as we have had up here this winter. In fact, the ice and sleet storms meant that Howard was away from his young family for days at a time. With all this wonderful snow, Joan decided she could at last have the sleight ride party she had wanted all her life. Elaborate preparations were made. Seven other young couples, all in their twenties, were invited from Walkerton and Georgetown and Brampton. Despite the blinding snow storm that blocked many district roads on Saturday, all the couples got through to the farm southeast of Durham. Some brought their small children. The wind died down in the evening. It was a glorious night. Arrangements had been made to rent a team and sleight from a neighbour. A baby sitter stayed with the children who were sound asleep in their beds. Dressed for the occasion, the young couples were having a wonderful time, in the crisp wintry air. They took turns riding astride the horses. They were out for a couple of hours until after midnight when the accident occurred. Nobody knows exactly what happened but Jack Lowin of Georgetown fell off the end of the sleight. His left leg was broken in two places. Jack is the husband of Joan's sister. The injured man was taken by sleight a couple of miles back to the house. He was later taken to Durham Hospital where Dr. Duncan put the leg in splints. Meanwhile, back at the ranch - the huge banquet with tuna fish casserole, etcetera, was all ready for the 2 a.m. feast. But no one had any appetite. While waiting for reports about the injured man, no person got any sleep. They picked half heartedly at the food. But the gaiety was gone from the occasion. On Sunday Jack Lowin was removed to Guelph Hospital where pins were used to repair the fracture. He will likely be in hospital for ten days. He probably won't be back at work in the Georgetown paper mill for some time.
