

# Credit Valley Bottling Receives Coveted Award

A singular honour has been bestowed upon Credit Valley Bottling Works, Mount Pleasant, Ont., as recently they were presented with a marble and gold plaque by The Charles E. Hires Co. for 12 months of consistent quality perfection.

Announcement of the Award had been made by Edgar Hires, vice-president of the parent company in St. Louis during the ABCB convention last November and early this month official presentation of the award was made by A. J. Gus Clarke, general sales manager of Hires for Canada and Ontario representative Jack Johnson.

The handsome plaque will have a place of honour upon the walls of the Credit Valley plant, along with other quality excellence awards already won by this plant.

The presentation of the award is the first such made to a Canadian Hires bottler and a look through their quality reports seems to indicate that the plant is now well on its way to another 'perfect score.'

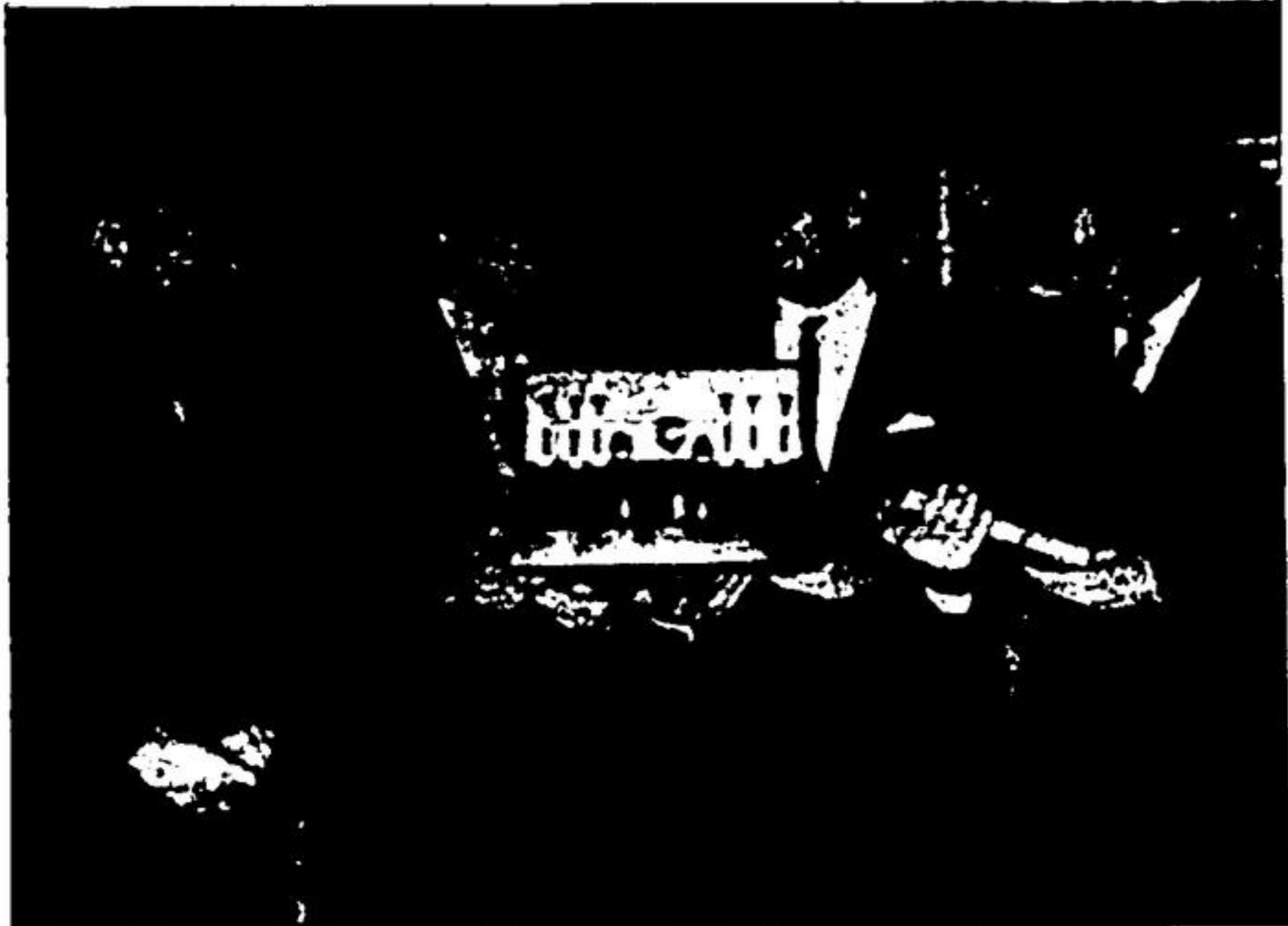
The plant is operated by the Schenk family, Harold, 35, who is production manager accepted the presentation from Mr. Clarke, Donald, 52, and Kenneth, 23, who are responsible for sales management, also participated in the occasion as did William Schenk, their father, and founder of the plant.

"Sterilization is the main point to our success," says Harold Schenk, "and we are blessed here with an excellent water supply from a natural well which we use for product only." Spruce and Donald Spruce, (a summer employee) took great pride in their work in this respect.

In presenting an additional prize from Hires' Canadian operation of a chest of silver, Mr. Johnson said: "On every occasion on visiting this plant, I have always found Harold Schenk to be extremely quality conscious. I feel that through his continual efforts along this line the results shown are very justified."

In expressing his congratulations on the award, Mr. Clarke noted that there is considerable "job satisfaction" and a big honour for a job well done. "I am happy," he said, "that this honour fell to Ontario."

William Schenk, the father, beamed in the background. He has retired from the active operation of the plant, but still keeps busy helping the boys out. He started Credit Valley in 1922 in Glen Williams, Ont., moving to the present location in 1947. A partner who had joined with Mr. Schenk in 1922, shortly after investing \$500 to start the organization, barked out, "I bought him out for the \$500 in 1922," says Mr. Schenk, "but I didn't know where I was going."
