

Town Would Pay Major Share in Proposed Dam

A dam which would create a recreation lake in the Hungry Hollow part of Georgetown does not seem to be in the immediate future, unless the town finds a fairly godmother. Reporting to council recently on various activities of the Credit Valley Conservation Authority, Alex MacLaren said the million dollar dam would be a major financial responsibility of the town which would benefit most from its creation. Mr. MacLaren is Georgetown's representative on the Authority. The dam would receive a 25% government grant if it were built today, he said, and while other municipalities in the area would pay a small share, the balance would have to be footed locally. This year the Authority had drawn up a budget of which Georgetown's share is \$8,453.

Add \$13,000 Grader To Town Equipment

Purchase of a road grader will add a \$13,000 capital asset to Georgetown's machinery department. A motion to purchase a re-conditioned Adams machine passed Monday on a recorded vote at council meeting with Reeve Sargent and Cr. Gunn opposing the purchase. Cr. Harrison pointed out \$750 spent in a month on machine rental and said he estimates 90¢ of every dollar for winter control is for grading. His comments were echoed by Mayor Hyde who said he estimates the town budget will be upped \$5,000 this year, taking rental saving into consideration, that next year the town will break even, and after that will be money in pocket. Cr. Kelly said the purchase is being made for little more than the previous owner was allowed, and considerable work has been done to put the machine in top shape. Cr. Cass supported his statement, saying that the previous owner had been contacted, the road committee had examined invoices for rebuilding, and the town is getting a good buy. Reeve Sargent said he would like to get other prices before deciding, asked if the purchase had been included in the budget.
