WHAT COUNCIL DID

Want New Town Truck Budget Won't Allow Plans to advertise for tenders for a new 1/2-ton works truck were vetoed Monday when Mayor Hyde strongly opposed an expenditure which he said the town could not afford this year. The mayor, however, said he is agreeable to buying a second hand vehicle. "I hope the town isn't so hard up we can't afford a truck" commented Cr. John Elliott. "I think you were aware some time ago that we are" replied Mayor Hyde. Deputy Reeve Gray and Cr. Hunter, who had made the motion, decided then to withdraw it and the matter was left in abeyance. Another withdrawn motion was one by which delegations would be limited to two evenings monthly, allowing more time at other meetings for routine council business. The idea had been proposed last week by the mayor and seemed to find favour with the councillors, though some doubts were expressed about the plan. Cr. Elliott was opposed. "Ratepayers should be allowed to bring their problems anytime and I don't think it unduly delays our business" he said. Reeve Sargent said he was sympathetic to the motion, but there are times when a ratepayer's problem is immediate and should be attended to. Claiming that the term "citizens" does not apply to males alone, Cr. Harrison opposed a legal opinion that the \$1500 yearly grant to the Citizens Band could not be shared by the Girls Pipe Band as recently requested. Complaints of poor drainage were received from Guelph residents Dick Vandenberg and Fred Ross, who said they had been promised connections to a storm sewer, but as yet the sewer had not been installed. The project has been delayed, they were told, pending plans for highway widening. The engineer and road committee will look over their problem. Asked by the town to delay installation of underground cable on Main St. until next year, Lloyd Denby and Mr. Dickson of the Bell Telephone Co. appeared to explain that this must be done this year and that they would cooperate in every way to save the town added expense when Main St. paving is done later. A final answer will be given the company next Monday. A Glen Williams resident appeared to offer his services for dog control and council suggested he put his proposal in writing for consideration by a council committee.
