But the 16 Mile Creek won't be getting any new supplies or speckled trout, because Dept. of Lands and Forest speckled hatch wasn't as large as usual this year. Quantities slated for the 12 and Fairy Lake were not known. Mr. Reid said. The impending Kelso dam project northwest of Milton was taken into consideration when planning future fish stocking for the 16, he said. When the dam is erected the water will

have to be tested for temperature as it may be too cold for the speckles.

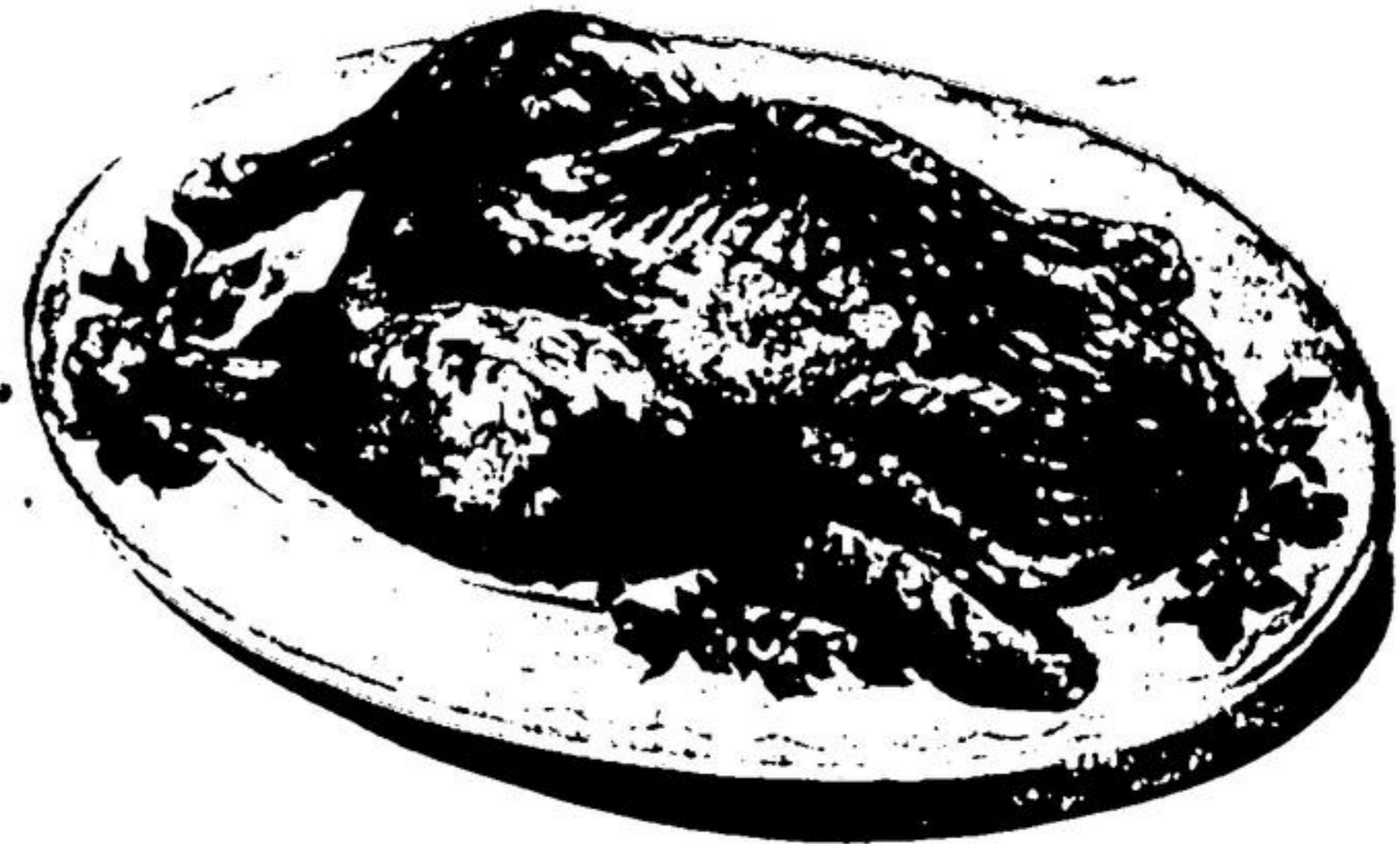
