



**END OF AN ERA.** The steam locomotive — work horse of the Canadian railway industry for 150 years — will disappear from Canadian railroads by the end of this year. The last steam engine appeared on the Canadian scene in 1880 with the advent of the Champlain and St. Lawrence Railway — long since incorporated into the CNR system. It was almost 80 years before the first diesel appeared — a rail car sent by CNR across the continent in 1925 from Montreal to Vancouver in 87 hours. It was followed in 1929 by a two-unit diesel road locomotive. Today, the railroads are moving away from steam power, largely dictated by depression and the war, but the program to displace the entire system may take another 10 years. The diesel-electric locomotive has proven to be cheaper and faster than its steam predecessor which has fallen victim to the advance of railroad technology. With the program completed, CNR will have 2,144 diesel locomotives and 28 railcars.




