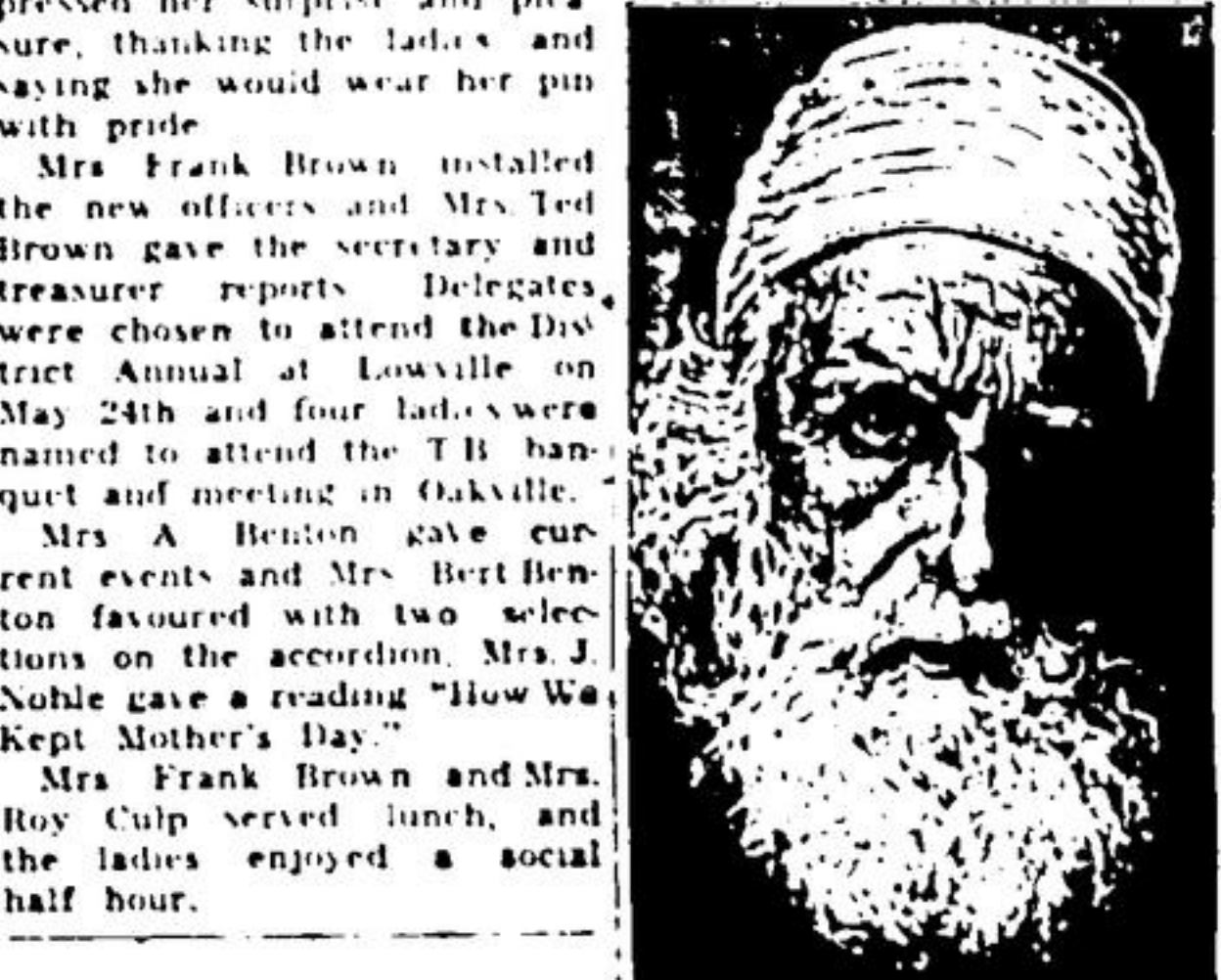
Weed Control News

AN EARLY 'BIRD'

Very often we hear slang expressions in which the word "bird" is used. The early bird gets the worm, birds of a feather flock together, and that fellow is quite a bird, are a few examples. The early "bird" referred to in this article is the first blossom seed to flower in the spring, namely "Yellow Rocket". It belongs to the mustard family but is somewhat different in appearance and flower than wild mustard. This year several patches were in bloom as early as the seventh of May. This weed, sometimes referred to as "saintly snapper" is increasing rapidly in Halton County. While it does spread from its own seeds it has been introduced to farms in most cases in clover seed and like its relatives in the mustard family its seed sometimes lies dormant in the soil for years. I have been told that seed from this family have been known to germinate under favorable conditions after lying in the ground for fifty years. The Latin name for Yellow Rocket is *Barbarea* because the green leaves were often eaten on St. Barbara's day, it's common name is Winter Green which it has very well earned. The young leaves cooked, drained to remove the first water, then cooked again with a pinch of soda, give a dish of greens with a faint flavour of horse radish. It may also be eaten raw as a salad, however this is a dish for those who enjoy a tangy flavour to their food. If the above recipes appeal to you please go out and pick or preferably pull Yellow Rocket to your heart's content. The time to attack this early "bird" is when it first appears on your farm. If there are only a few plants pull them out by the roots. If there are many plants in a hay field, cut it early before the seed sets, you will get better hay or grass silage as well. Herbicides such as M.C.P. applied in the fall or butyrates in early spring will help to control this weed in clover fields. For more detailed information on the control of Yellow Rocket consult "Your Guide to Chemical Weed Control" published by the Ontario Dept. of Agriculture. Copies are available at the office of the Agricultural Representative or through the County Weed Inspector.

**North Halton Board
Was 'Below Average'
Says Tely**

According to a Toronto daily the new disbanded North Halton High School District Board, of which Georgetown was a part, received one of the lowest ratings of 231 high school boards graded in a survey by the Ontario Secondary Schools Teachers' Federation. "The Telegram" in its report in the May 11th issue, listed the North Halton board in one of the categories "Attitude Toward Educational Improvement" above only 24 other boards in the province, with 250 points of a possible 400. The board was 202nd with 243 points in "Relations Between Board and Staff" and in "Conditions of Work" the teachers rated the board 203rd with 263 points.
