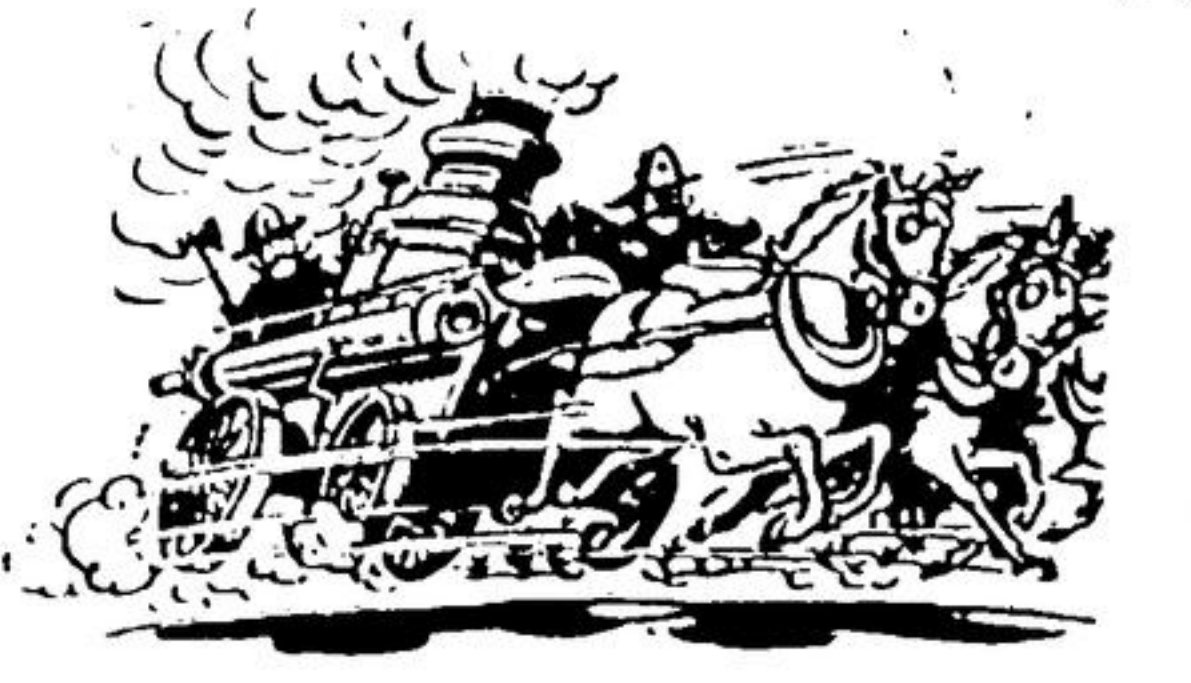
Georgetown Girl Weds In Valleyfield Cathedral
