Conclude Local Course In First Aid Training

Again this year, Georgetown and area residents showed their willingness to learn what to do in the case of sudden accident and injuries. More than 25 local people attended a St. John's Ambulance first aid course held in the Odd Fellows hall during April and May, including many Boy Scouts, employees of town industries, and members of the volunteer ambulance corps. Capable instructor, Jack Hunter, of Guelph, conducted the eight week course, concluding with an examination on May 25th. Georgetown doctors, Dr. M. Bricester and Alan Thompson, officiated at the exam while Mr. Hunter tested the students on artificial respiration. The number of those passing the course is expected to be high, although results will not be known until returned from Ottawa in about two months.
