QUERIES LOWER IN BRAMPTON

Dear Sir:  
I would appreciate someone explaining to me why a residence in Brampton valued at approx. \$24,000, has a tax rate of \$336 which means an average of approx. \$4.70, while a residence in Georgetown, valued at \$12,000, with no side walks, storm sewers etc. is assessed at \$4,775 and, pays taxes of \$316.

Is this the result of lack of industry, or as was quoted in the press, to help pay the taxes of delinquents. If lack of industry is the prime cause then how in heaven's name will the building of further masses of houses help to arrest this excessive rise in taxes.

Will a token payment per lot in lieu of industry lower taxes? if so for how long, a year? surely this is no compensation for industry which would probably be here, and taxable for perhaps the next fifty years.

Pardon my ignorance on these matters, but I believe I am not alone in this matter of querying rising costs, and wondering where it will cease if ever.

Again quoting a press report of a councillor I believe, who said that if costs continued to rise the rats would leave the sinking ship, he surely has foresight. There are still some rats left, but I wonder how many are looking for cheaper nests.
