## Pioneer Village Displays Early Business Places

Vice-regal pomp and ceremony blended with early 19th century pioneer costume and trappings to mark the official dedication of the Pioneer Village being developed by the Metropolitan Toronto and Region Conservation Authority.

Dedication ceremonies were highlighted by the participation of His Honor, Lieutenant Governor J. Keiller Mackay who climaxed the dedication by planting a 15-foot spreading chestnut tree beside the blacksmith shop built in 1855.

More than 400 persons attended the ceremony which also saw the official opening of the 86-acre Black Creek Conservation Area in which the Pioneer Village is located.

Prising at the dedication was Rev. Dorothy Hagan of Swan Bay, chairman of the METRCA's historic sites advisory board.

During the tree-planting ceremony, J. H. Richardson, P. Eng., Dept. of Planning & Development, and a former chairman of the Authority, unveiled a stone tablet commemorating the occasion.

Text on the tablet reads: "This tree was planted by the Honorable J. Keiller Mackay, D.S.O., V.D., L.L.D., the Lieutenant Governor of Ontario, on the occasion of the dedication of the Pioneer Village, June 2, 1960."

A tour of inspection of the 11 buildings already established on the site was carried out. The tour included the blacksmith's shop, artisan's residence, exterior of the Lasky emporium, log grain barn, settler's first house, log pigery, smoke house, two-story log house, square's house and the Dalziel bath and museum.
