### Shows Safety Tips To 4-H Club Members

Three hundred 4-H Club Members and parents attended the Halton 4-H Parents Safety Night, held on the Grandstand at Milton Fair Grounds on June 2nd.

As a result of the Accident Survey carried out in Halton County, it was found that farm machinery and in-laws accidents were two of the most important causes of injury.

Mr. H. E. Wright, Safety Specialist for the Ontario Department of Agriculture, put on a demonstration of tipping accidents with a scale model of a farm tractor. He stressed the importance of having the wheels extended to the maximum width to prevent the tractor from rolling over, and the correct procedure to follow when a tractor is stuck.

Considerable time was given to the importance of proper lighting on farm machinery.

Mr. Wright demonstrated some reflective materials. Flashing lights and reflective paint which should be used on the rear of slow moving equipment.

A Work Sheet was filled out by each of the 4-H Club Members covering the regulations for farm wheels to travel on the highway and other information of importance to young drivers. This material was then illustrated in the film, "A Day in Court" which stressed the importance of a good driving attitude for safety on the highway.
