Shows 'Safety Tips To 4-H Club Members

Three hundred 4-H Club Members and parents attended the Halton 4-H Parents Safety Night, held on the Grandstand at Milton Fair Grounds on June 3rd.

As a result of the Accident Survey carried out in Halton County, it was found that farm machinery and to hawks accidents were two of the most important causes of injury.

Mr. H. E. Wright, Safety specialist for the Ontario Department of Agriculture, put on a demonstration of tipping accidents with a scale model of a farm tractor. He stressed the importance of having the wheels extended to the maximum width to prevent the tractor from rolling over, and the correct procedure to follow when a tractor is stuck.

Considerable time was given to the importance of proper head, Uterson and Winder lighting on farm machinery, mere Muskoka districts.
