Safety Rulers Catchy Reminder for Children

For the twelfth successive year Ontario's elementary school children have been given a traffic safety reminder to help them remember their traffic safety rules through the summer months.

Transport Minister John Yaremko announced today that one million safety rulers with the theme "Play Safely and You'll Grow Safely" have been distributed through the schools to children in the junior grades. The ruler contains the eight elementary rules of child safety and is a handy guide to measure the progress of the child's height and weight over the period of one year.

Requests from schools have been pouring into the Department's Highway Safety Branch in unprecedented volume. The rulers were distributed to the children just before leaving school for their summer vacation. They were encouraged to take the rulers home to use as a useful reminder that traffic accidents never take a holiday.

Mr. Yaremko, in making the announcement, also entered a plea for the parents of Ontario's younger children to carry on the vital work of educating the youngsters in traffic safety during the months where they are away from their teacher's supervision.
