Avert Serious Blaze At Standard Products

An alert company official and quick action by firemen saved the Standard Products Building from being reduced to a pile of smouldering ashes Friday.

The hazard was created when garbage at the back of the factory somehow caught fire and leked flames perilously close to the rear wall. The official discovered the blaze at about 6.30 p.m. and turned in the alarm. Firemen used water from the truck to bring the flames under control in minutes.

Five panes of glass were burst by the heat. Children playing with matches are believed to have caused a grass fire that required the firemen Saturday afternoon near Sargant Rd. The call was turned in at about 4 o'clock and the brigade had little trouble dousing the blaze with water.

The grass fire prompted Fire Chief Bob Bonfield to issue a warning to parents to keep matches out of the reach of children. He said this is an especially dangerous time with so many dry standing fields of hay in the district. He also cautioned drivers against throwing burning cigarettes from their car windows.
