Seek Solution As Milton Needs \$24,000 To Finish High School

District Now Disbanded Adds To Cost Problem

No conclusions were reached as to funds totaling \$105,482.61 to be used for the Milton school or a shortage from the original requisition of \$24,517.39.

Defeating the overpayment to the Acton-Georgetown construction, the county had \$23,102.41 less to turn over to the district than was repositioned for.

The county treasurer's letter suggested the deficit be made up in levies on the five municipalities concerned either next year or over the next five years. Condition of such an agreement would make it possible for the county to pay the funds to the Milton District Board immediately and collect from the municipalities next year.

Shares of the amount were Acton \$3,308.07, Georgetown \$8,053.36, Milton \$4,699.08, Esquerring \$4,332.79 and Nassauwaya \$4,388.31.

The North Halton High School District Board has been dissolved and replaced with three separate districts at the first of the year.

Councillor Ian Cast, Georgetown, inquired from Mr. Brown if the other municipalities had to pay the amount to the Milton District Board. Mr. Brown noted they did, according to the Municipal Act.

Reeve John Greer, Acton suggested it seemed the municipalities were bound to pay the amount. He suggested Acton didn't want to pay it but it would be better to get it paid and deal with some of the other points of dissatisfaction such as boundaries. He suggested the possibility that Acton and Milton might consider a joint area as had been originally operated until Georgetown wanted to join.

There were a number of speakers and a review of the solution with no conclusions reached and no further meetings planned.
