Hi Sportsmen!  
Georgetown Anglers and Hunters voted at their last business meeting, to release the pheasants they have been raising for the last few months, at the earliest possible time.



HARVEY COPLAND, who had the pheasants housed in a coop at the back of his lot, told the attending members of the club that the birds were getting too tame, and he was afraid if they were kept much longer, they might not have enough time to regain their natural wildness before pheasant season opens.

It was also voted that the birds would be released in groups of 25, at locations to be determined at that time. These locations will be published at a later date along with any others, where pheasants have been sighted in Halton County.

The 150 pheasants that the club was raising at Bill BENNETT'S farm, on the 8th line at the 22nd sideroad, were released during the first week of August.

Local hunters, who hope to hunt the pheasants and other game, are reminded they must take a Hunter's Safety Course if they did not have a hunting license LAST YEAR. Any hunting license obtained in Ontario will serve this purpose.

Flashy Boy, a pacer, racing in the class D races at Connaught Park Raceway near Hull, Quebec, is bringing considerable recognition to his owner, Ed Caldwell of 10 Tyers Ave. Driven by Dan Campbell of Acton, Flashy Boy has copped three thirds and a first in his last five outings and according to his owner is improving each time out.

Ed, who became interested in horse racing three years ago has five horses in his growing stable. One of them, Legal Senator, was taken to the Connaught track Saturday and should be qualifying this week and another, Harvest Moon Lee, a four year old, is in training and will be racing in two weeks. Completing the five some are a yearling colt, Miss Tuddina Rosecroft and a brood mare, and here lies the future of the Caldwell racing venture.

Miss Tuddina Rosecroft has promise in that she is a three quarter sister to Howard Rosecroft which currently holds the track record at Old Woodbine. The mare was recently bred to Joe Dale by Adria which recent-

ly sold for \$300,000 and is the leading sire on the continent. Harvest Moon Lee and Flashy Boy can also boast about their background which includes a grand reserve championship at the 1958 Royal Winter Fair for their sire.
