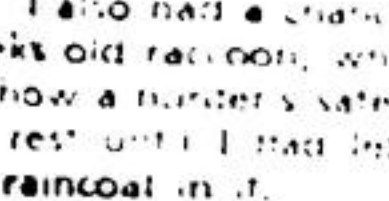

Out of a beginning class of 31 only 7 failed and percent age wise the passing rate was general as 75% of all who tried made it. The rest of the Red Cross enrollment included 20 juniors, 21 intermediates, and 5 seniors.
